FREE RANDOM DRUG SCREENING

With Parent approval for participation in the drug screening program, students will be tested randomly for the most commonly abused drugs. The test gives instant results and will be free of charge.

If the test is presumptive positive, parents may choose to have additional testing by their primary care physician or other healthcare professional.

Participation in the random drug screening program will give students a legitimate reason to say “NO” without losing face with their peers.

For agreeing to participate in 24-7 and paying annual dues of \$5, students will receive a wristband and t-shirt. Wearing the wristband will earn students incentives from local business sponsors and in their school.
