## Executive Summary – Service Array Process Child and Family Snapshot

The purpose of the Child and Family Snapshot is to provide relevant data to the Community Service Array Steering Committee. Information in the snapshot will be used by the group at each site during the process of assessing capacities and developing a Resource and Capacity Development Plan.

Elements contained in a Child and Family Snapshot represents both descriptive and analytical information.

Your Child and Family Snapshot was designed to answer the question “What information is collected and can be provided which will serve to inform the community members of a) who lives in their community and b) how does this information helps us to assess our community and develop our Resource and Capacity Development Plan?”

Your Child and Family Snapshot was developed from data and was used to reflect the array of services found in a system of care. The West Virginia System of Care is a public/private/consumer partnership dedicated to building the foundation for an effective continuum of care that empowers children at risk of out-of-home care and their families. Data was collected to address the entire System of Care as reflected below:

In addition, data was provided by the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources, Bureau for Children and Families and the Office of Planning and Quality Improvement of Bureau for Children and Families and from two (2) data sources common to Child Welfare: National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) and Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS).

These data sources contributed to a portion of the snapshot providing information on the children and families coming into the child welfare system in your community. The child welfare data sources will also provide needed information when the community work group begins to assess capabilities and outcomes specific to the Child and Family Service Review (CFSR).

In addition, three (3) statewide reports were considered pertinent for integration into the service array process. The three (3) reports are: 1) Advancing New Outcomes: Findings, Recommendations and Initial Actions of the West Virginia Commission to Study Residential Placement of Children; 2) West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources Bureau for Children and Families – A Comprehensive Clinical Review of Youth in Out-of-State Placements and 3) Reaching Every Child Addressing Educational Attainment of Out-of-Home Care Children in West Virginia. 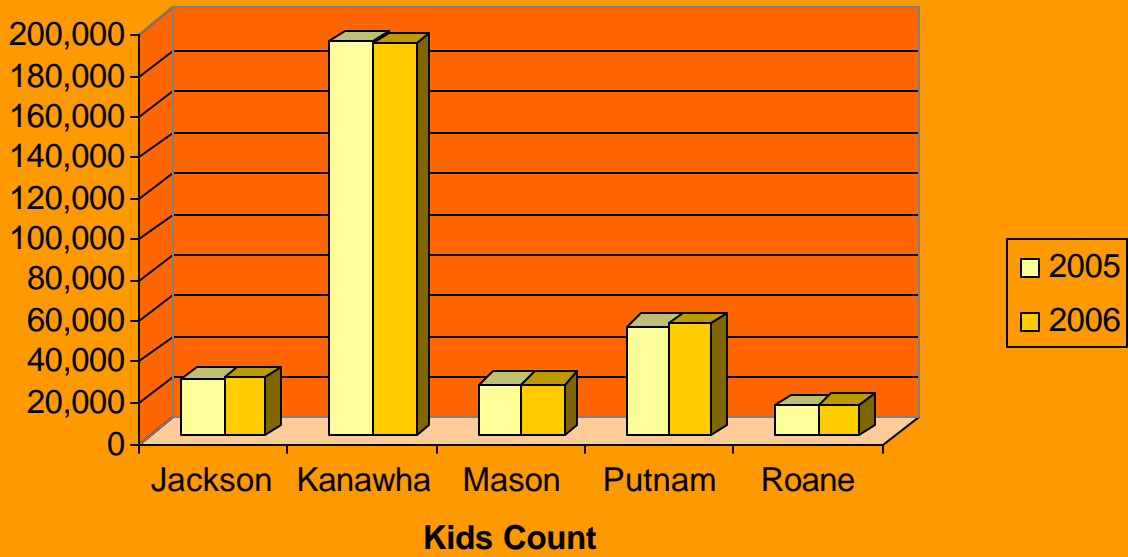

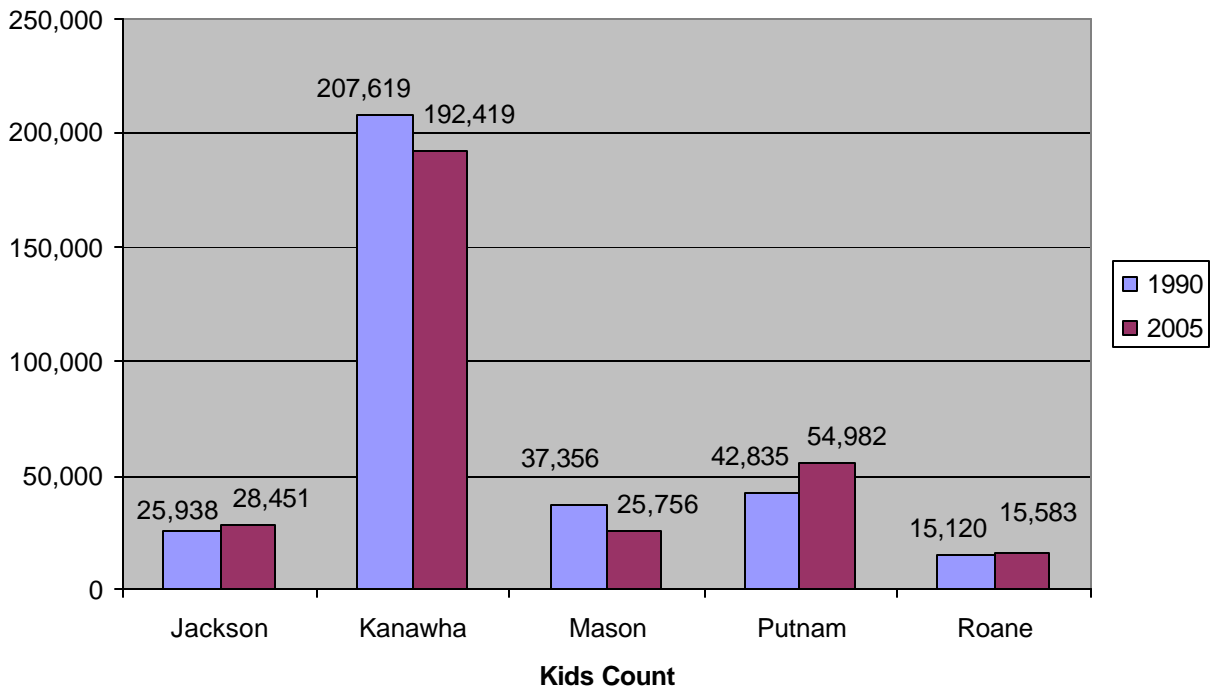

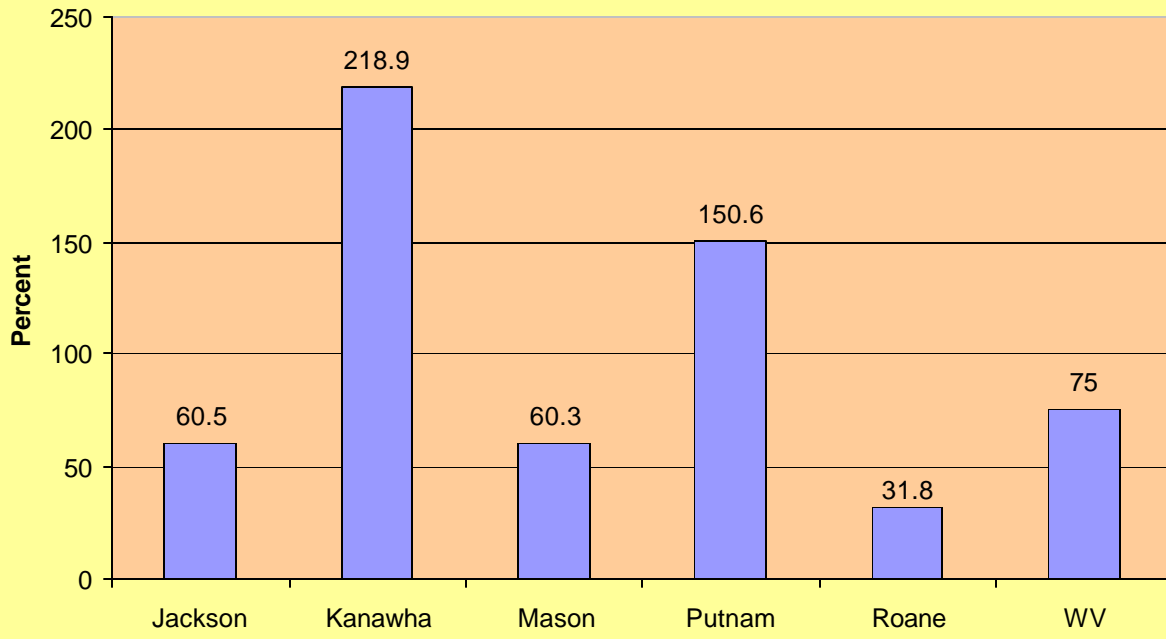
### Total Population 2005 - 2006



### Populaton Change 1990/2005

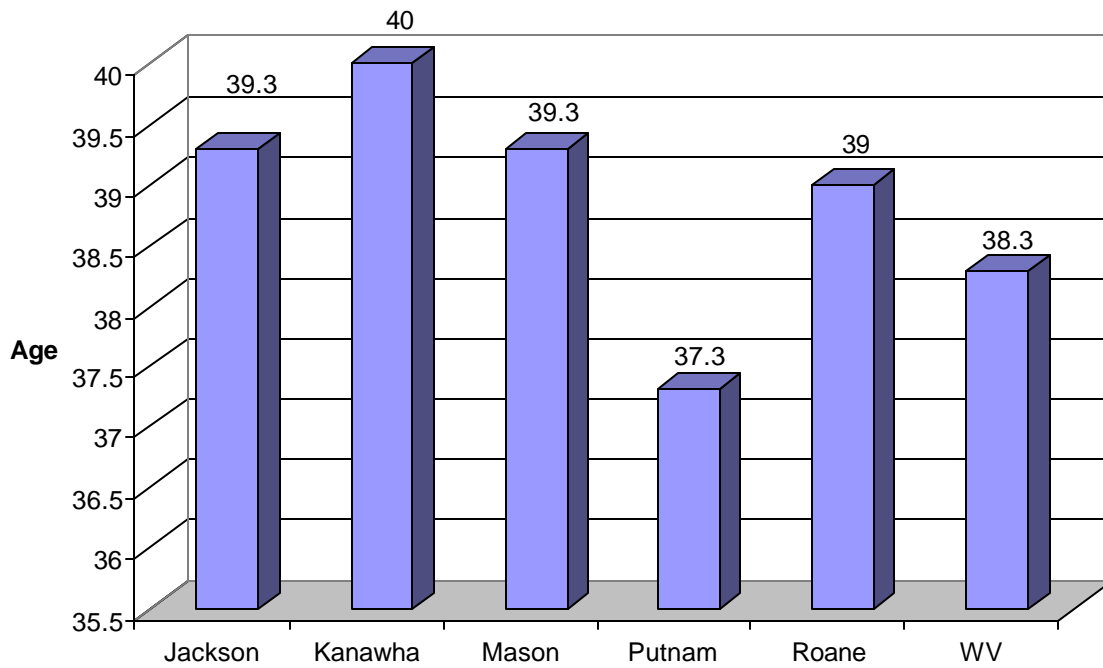


**Population Density Per Square Mile 1999 - 2003**



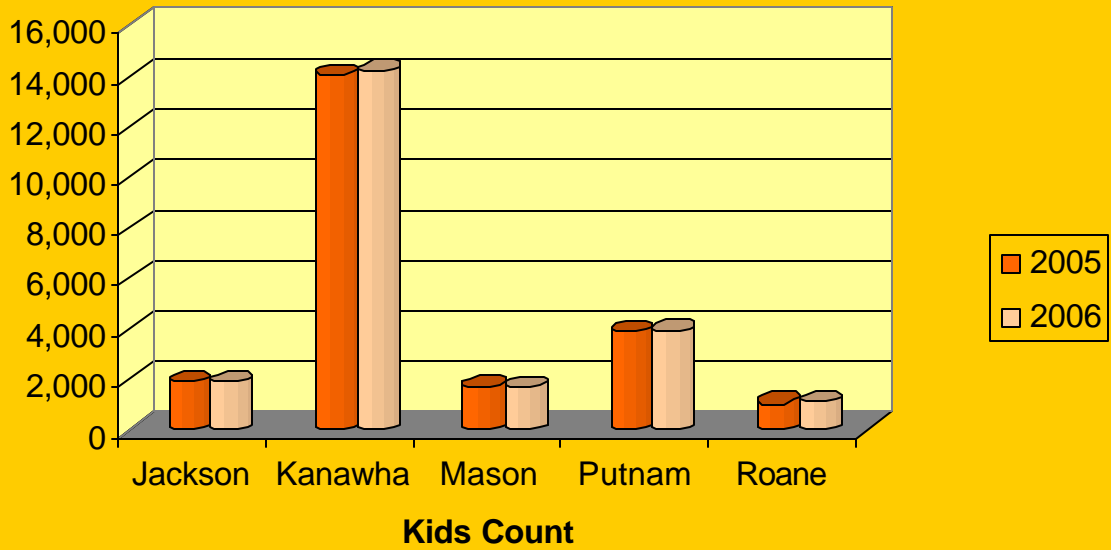

**Median Age 1999 - 2003**

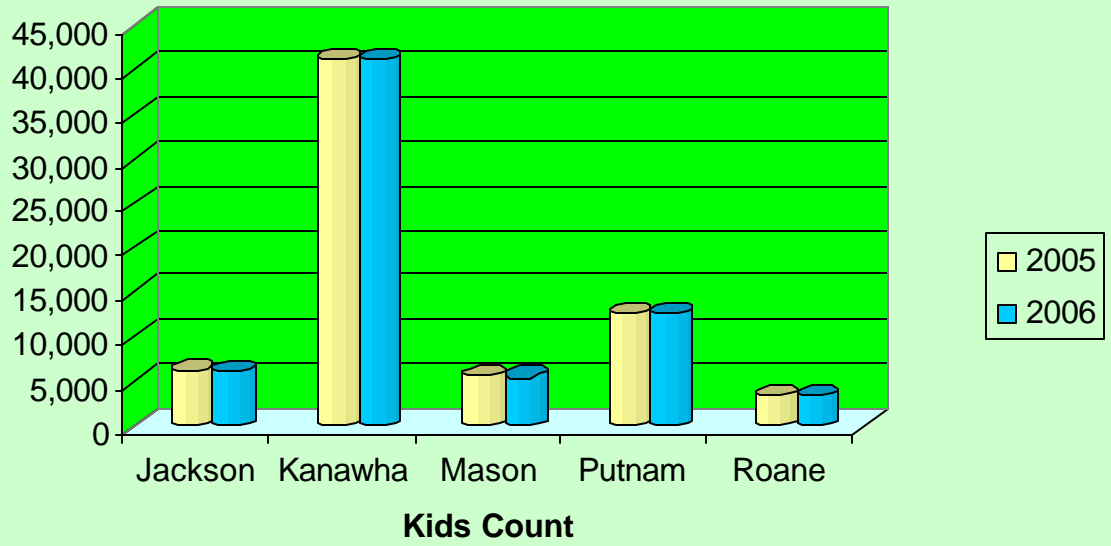

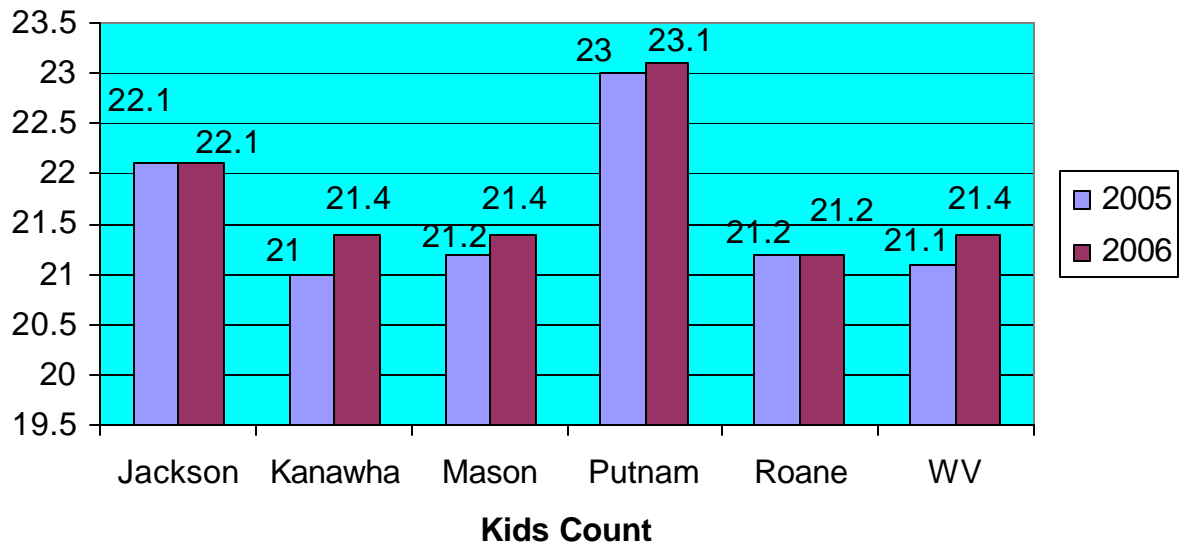
### # Children Under Age 6 2005 - 2006



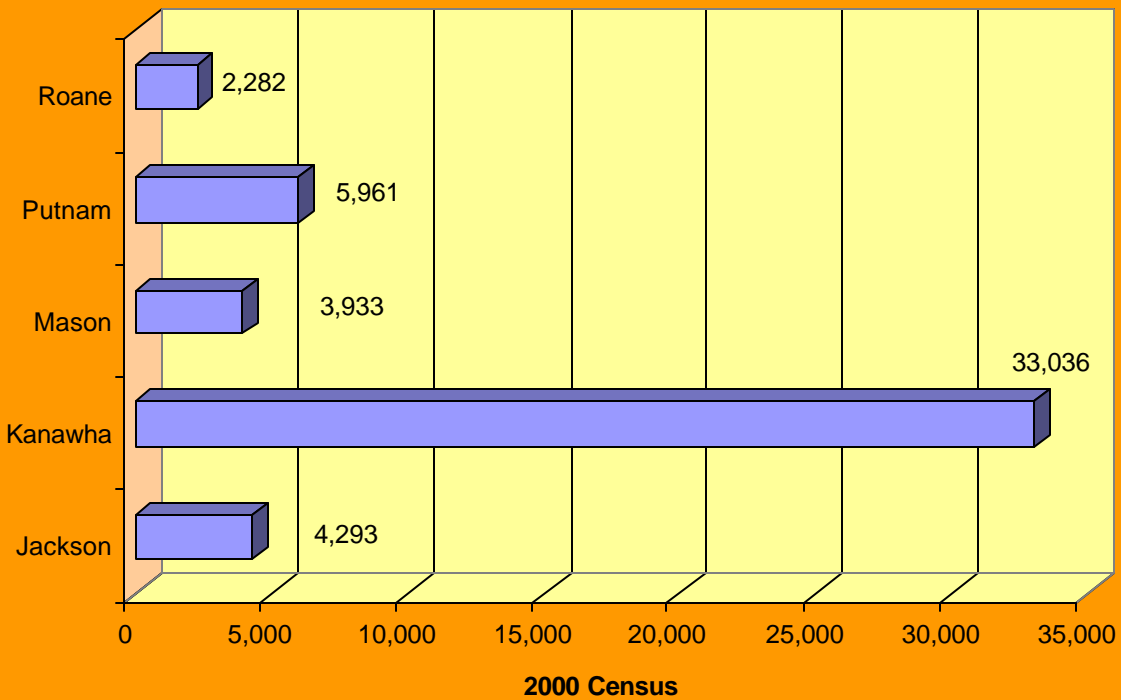
### Population Under 18 2005 - 2006



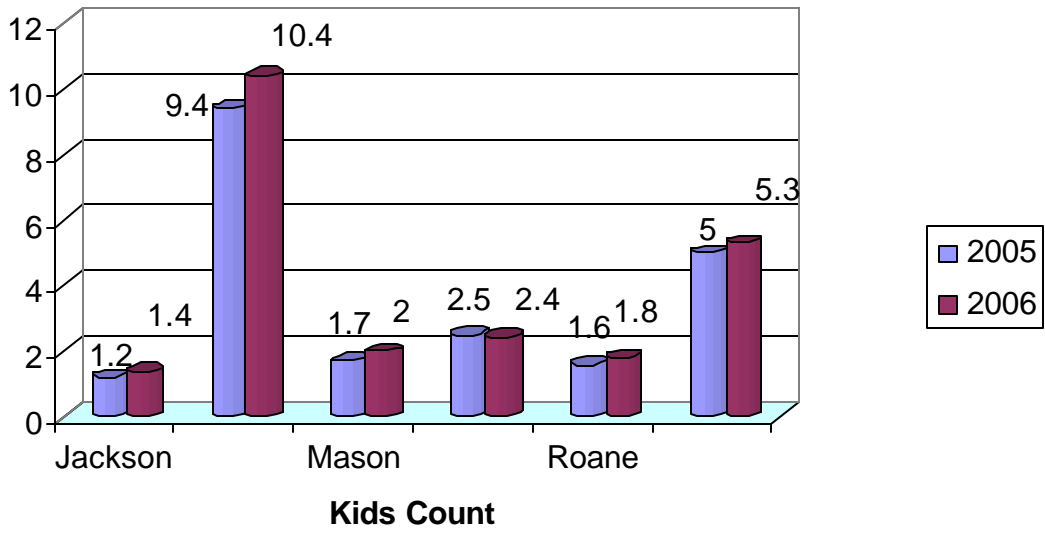

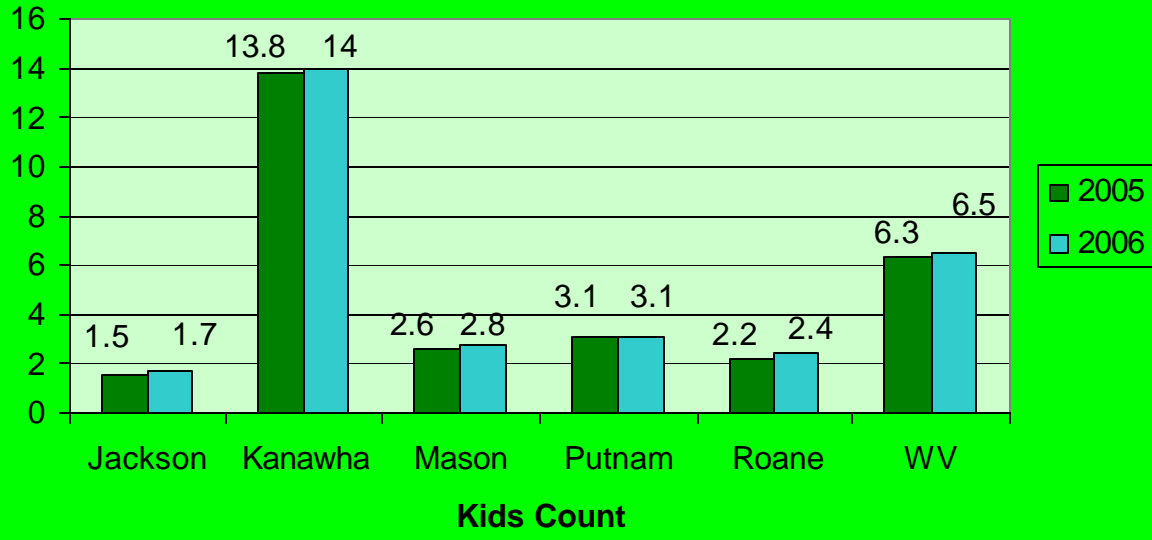

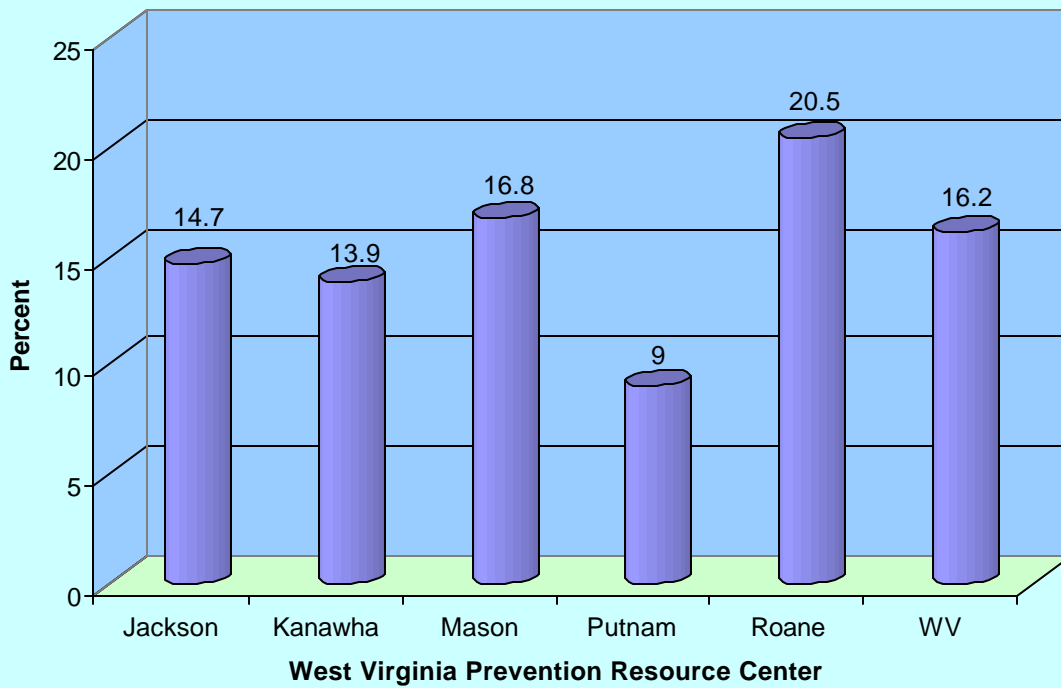
### % Minority Population 2005 - 2006



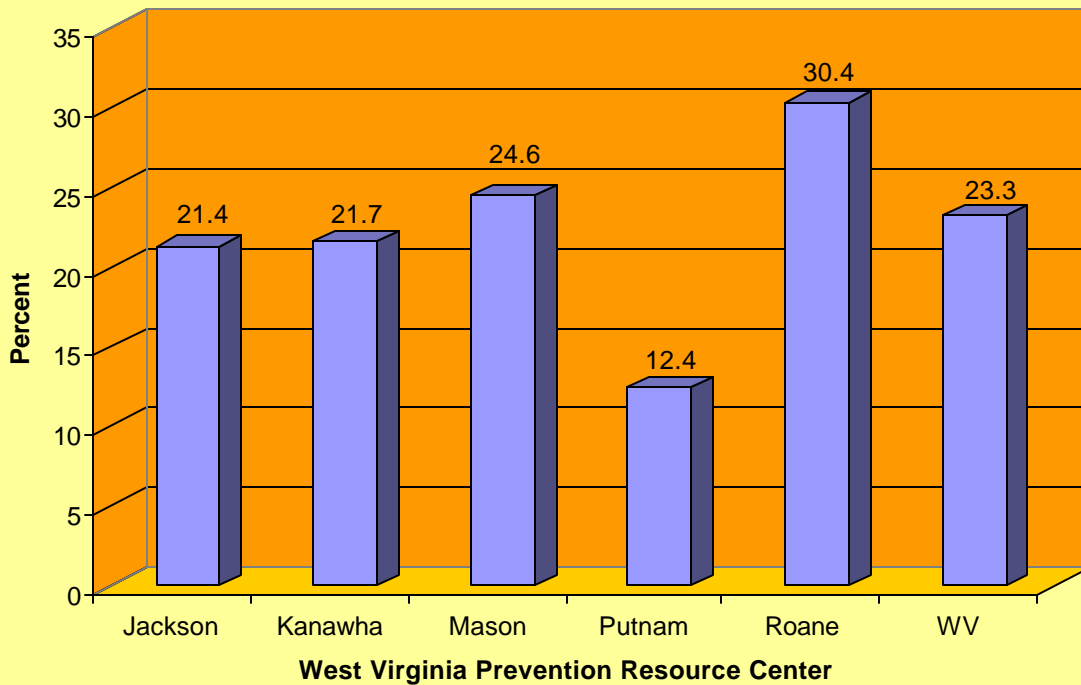
### % Children Under Age 18 Who are Minority

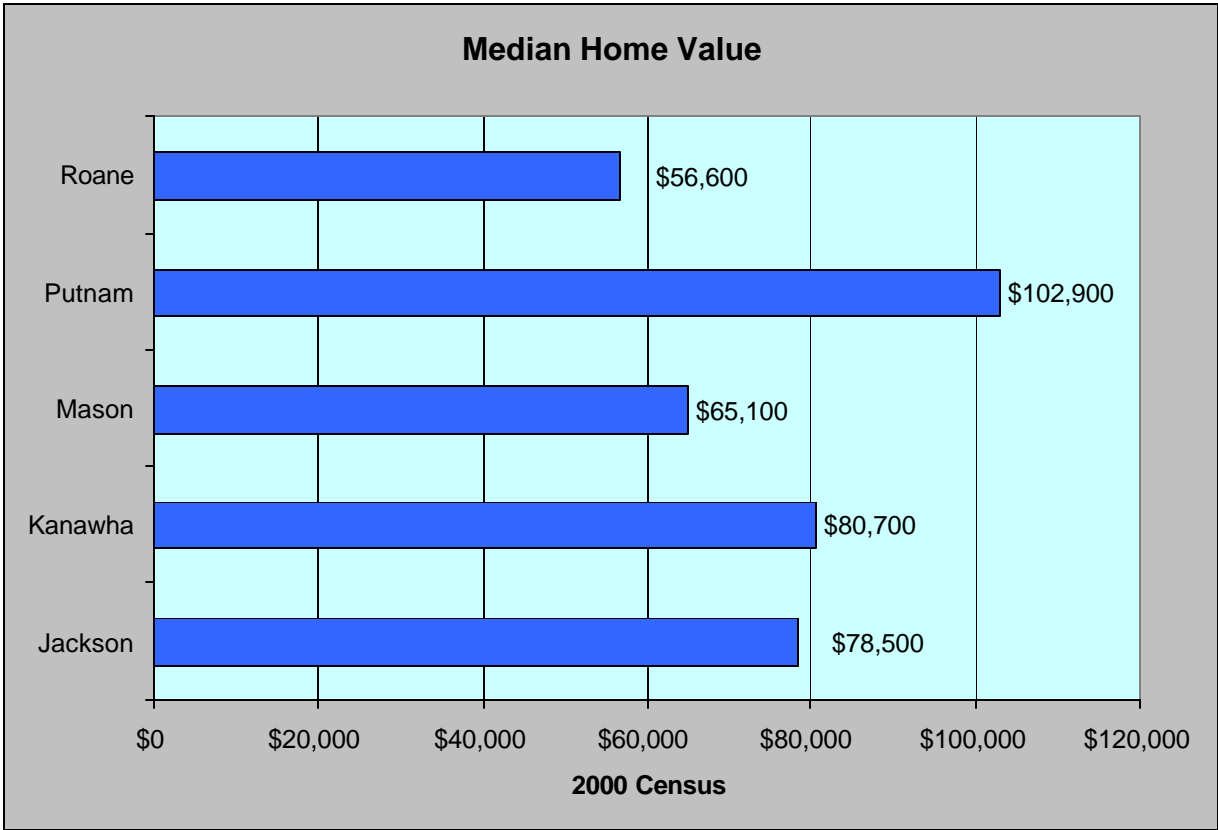
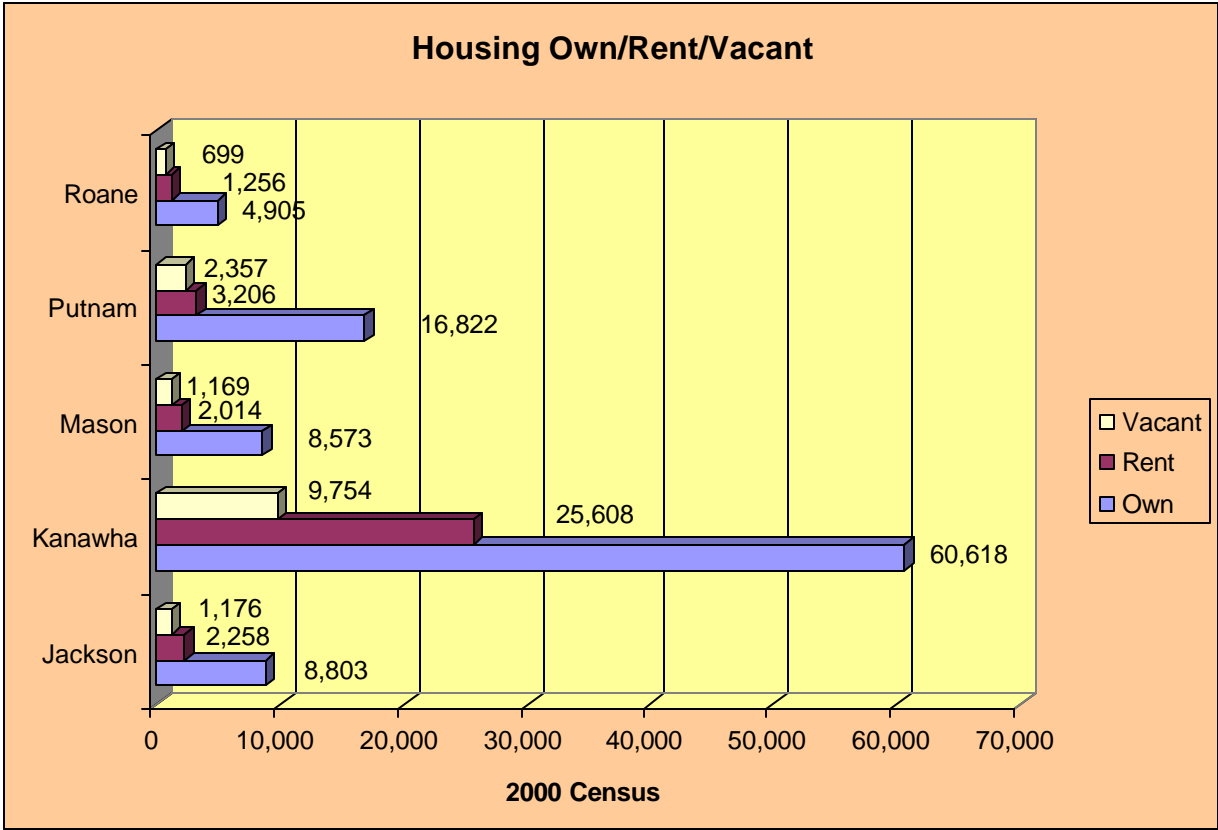


**Population Below Poverty 1999 - 2002**

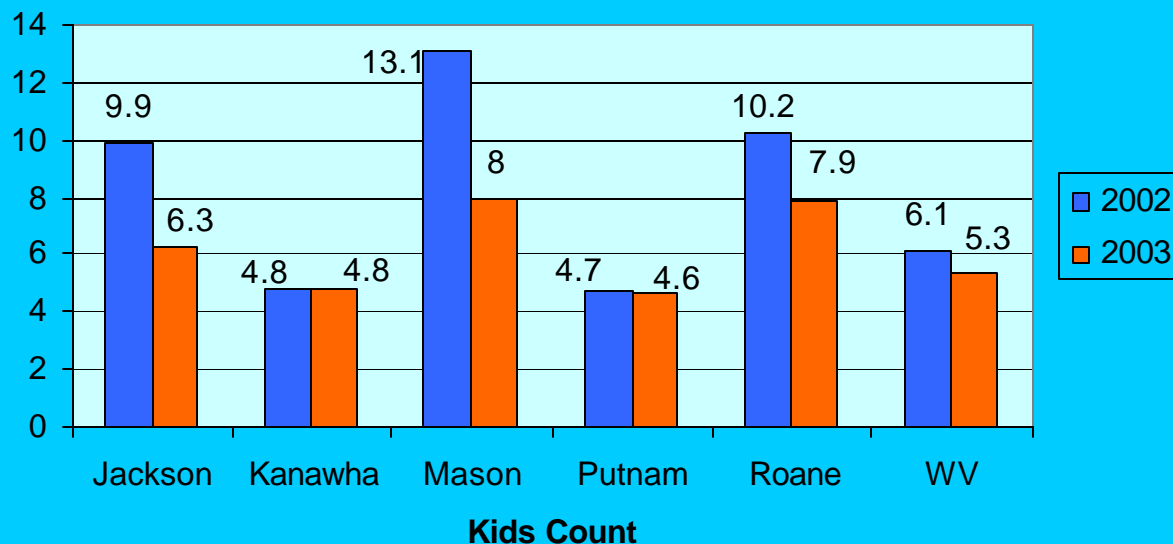


**% Children Below Poverty 1999 - 2002**

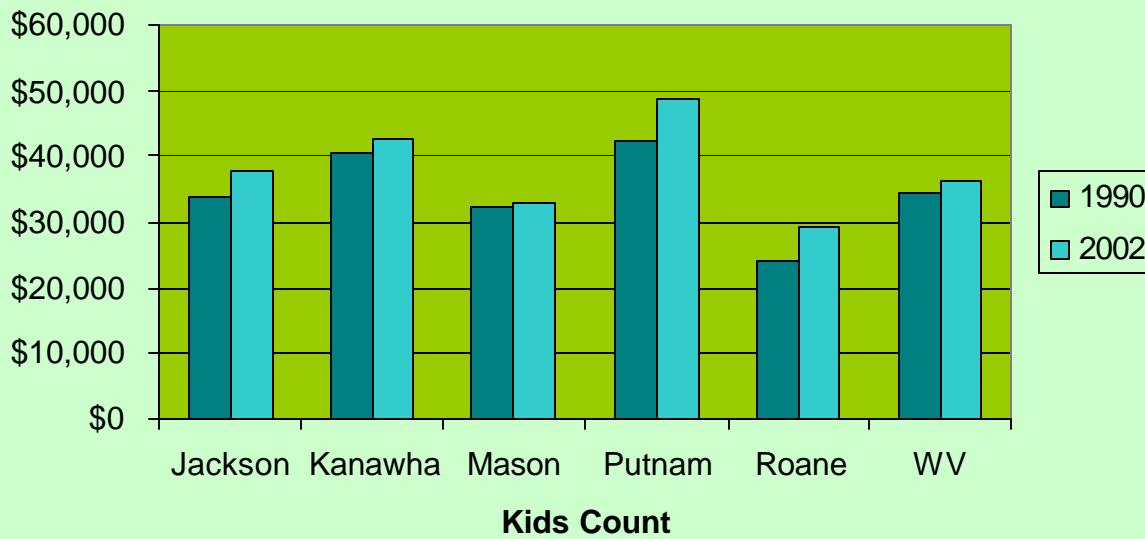




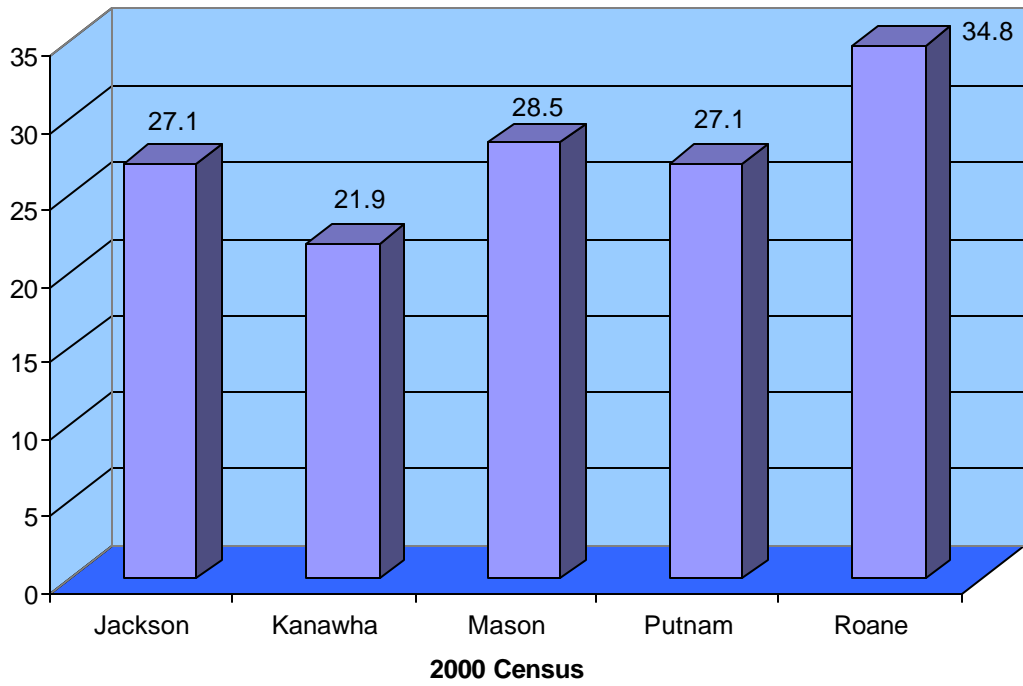
### Unemployment 2002 - 2003



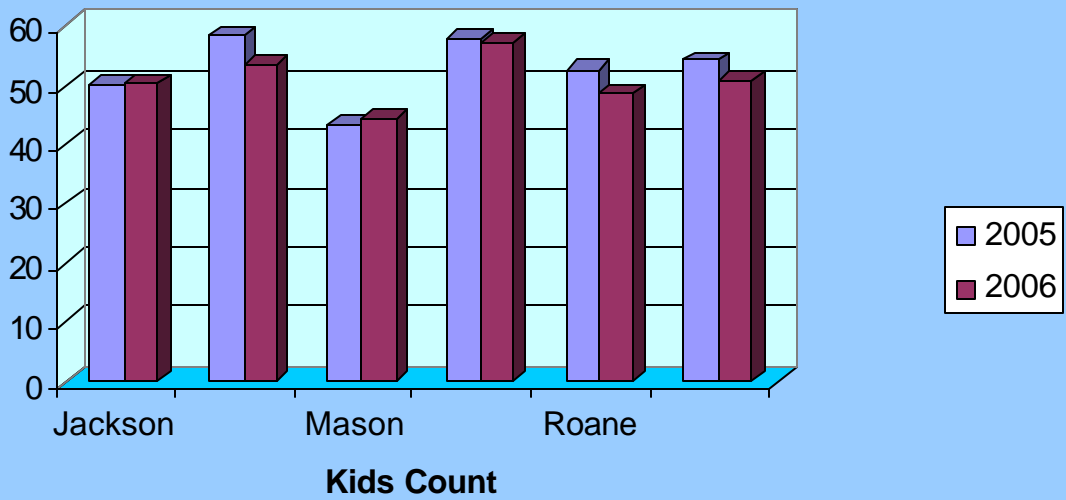
### Median Family Income 1990 2002 (1999 Dollars)

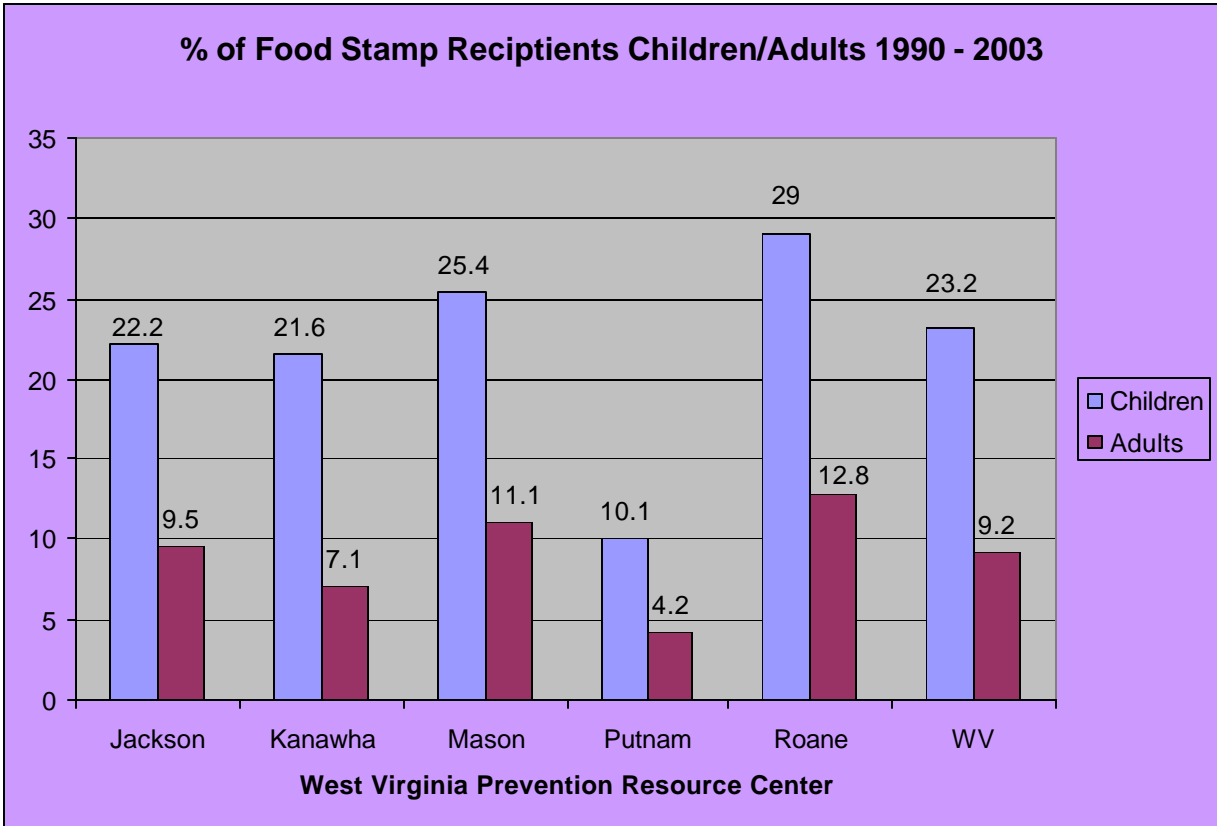
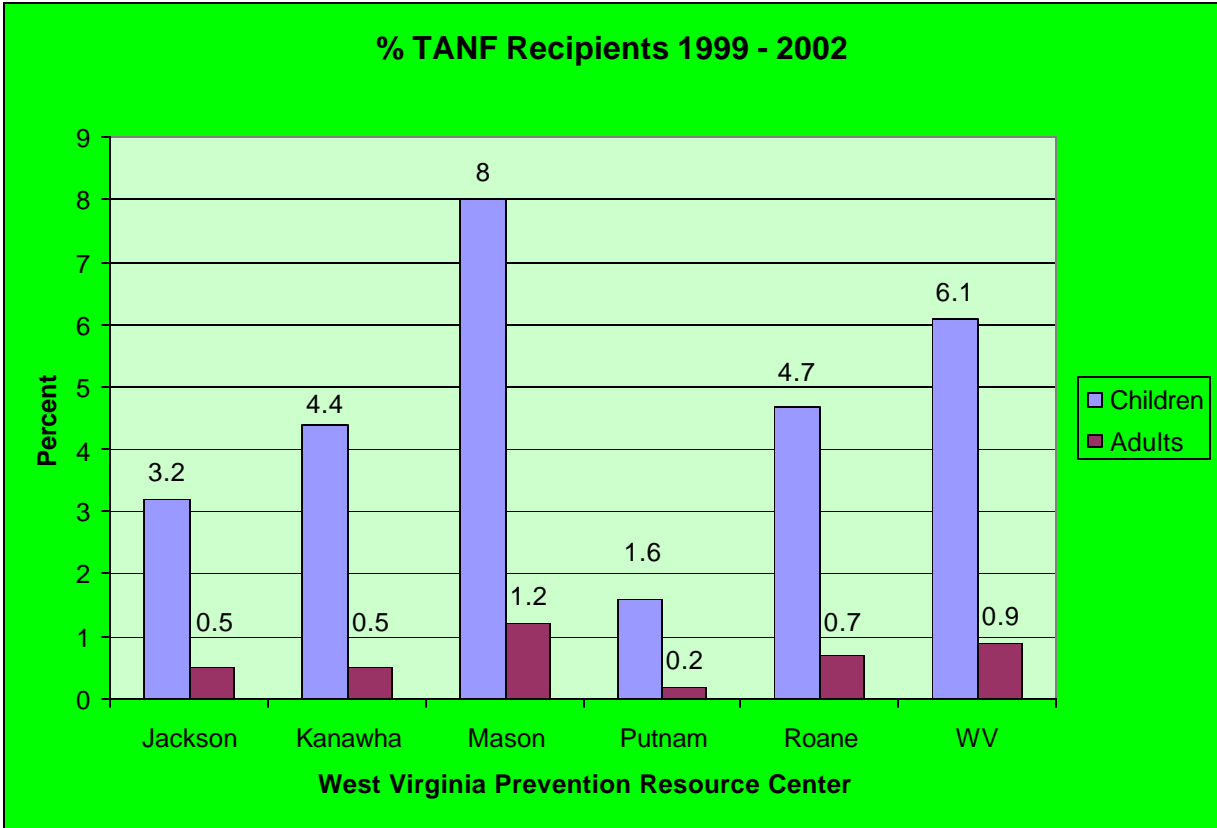


**Travel Time to Work (Mean Time in Minutes)**

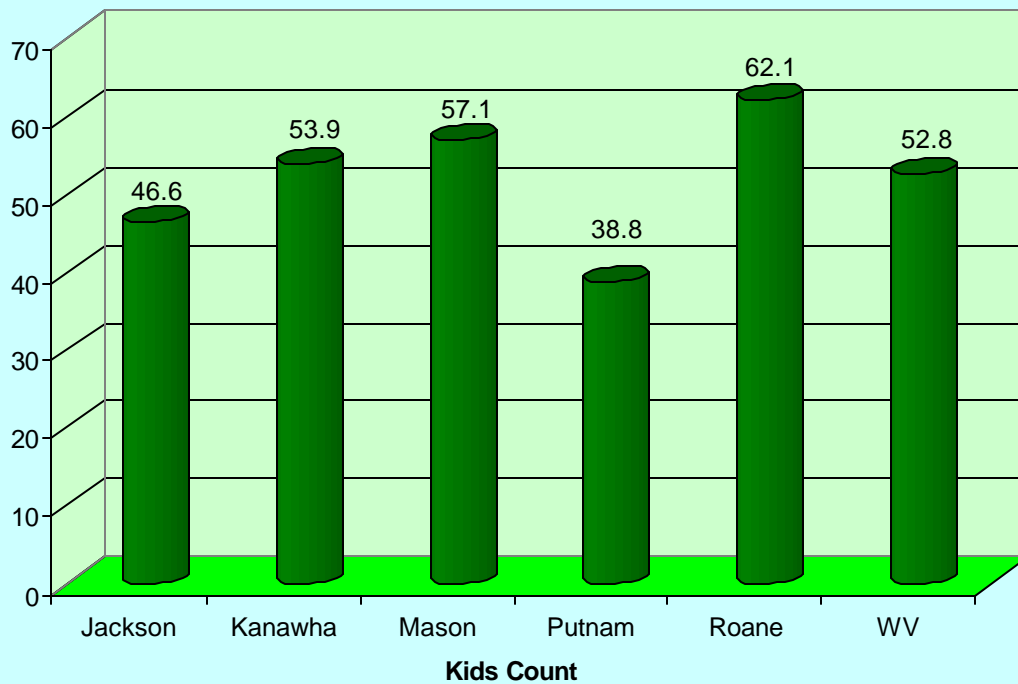


**% Children Under Age 6 Who Live in Families with Parents in Labor Force 2005 - 2006**

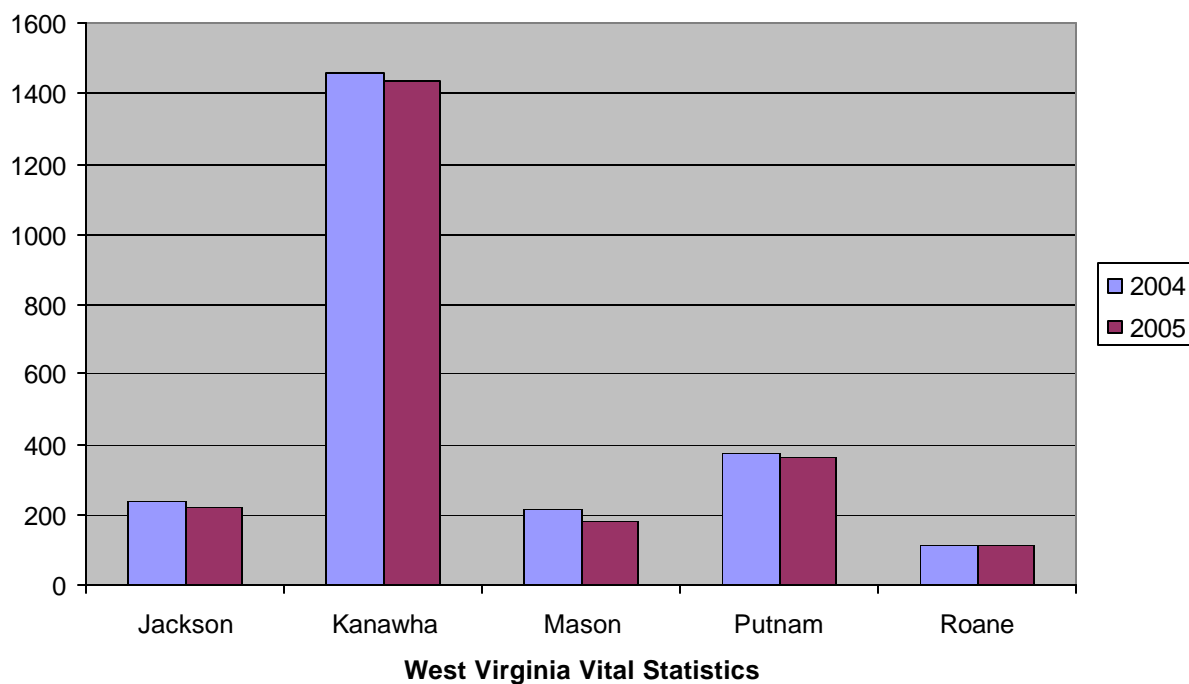




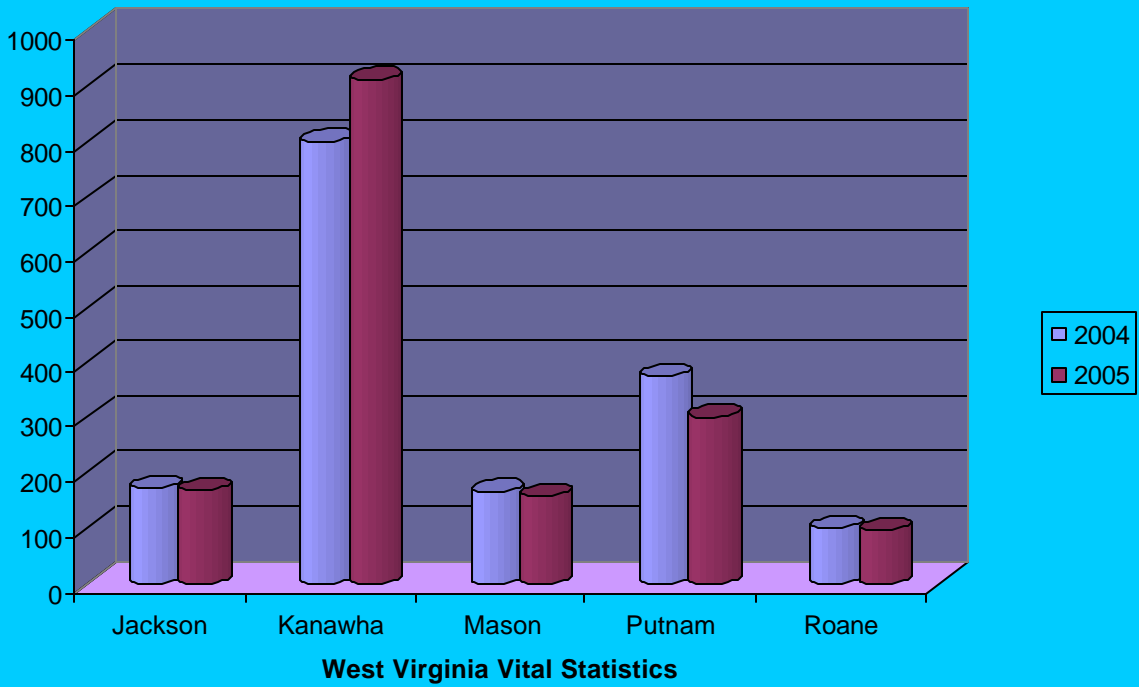
**% Children Approved for Free and Reduced Meals 2005**



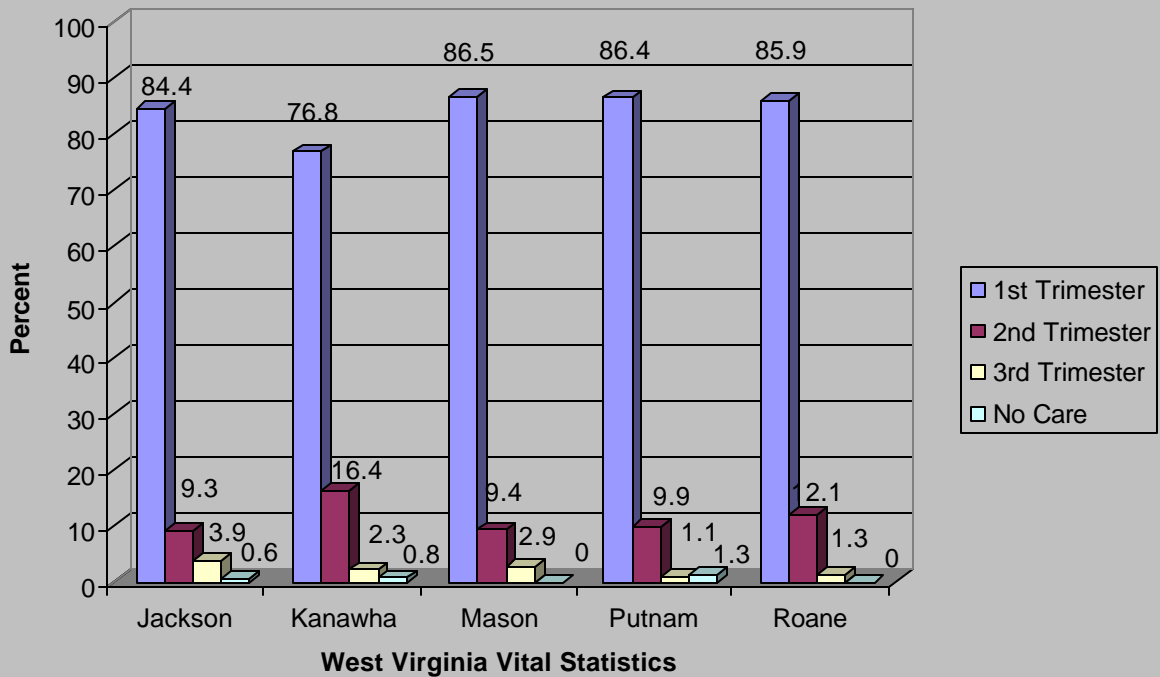
**# of Marriages 2004 - 2005**



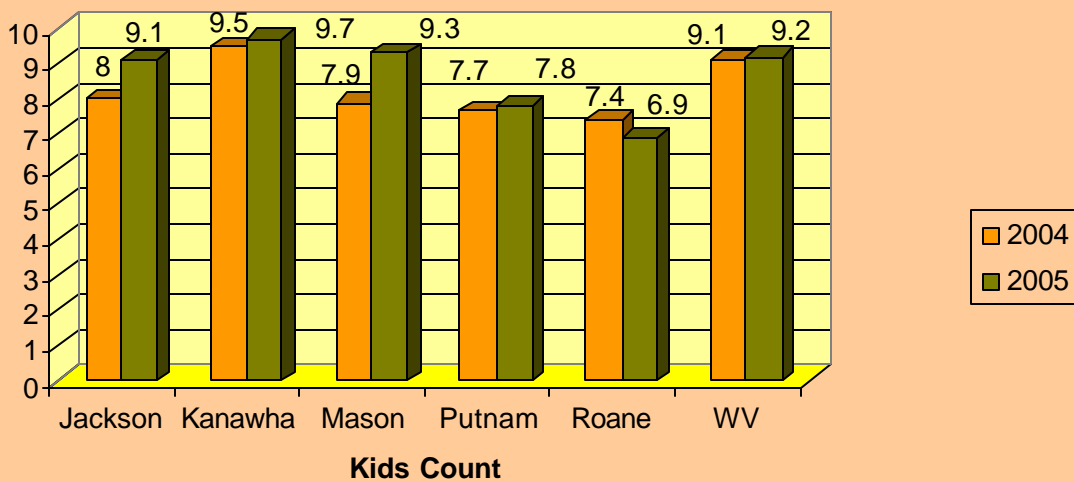

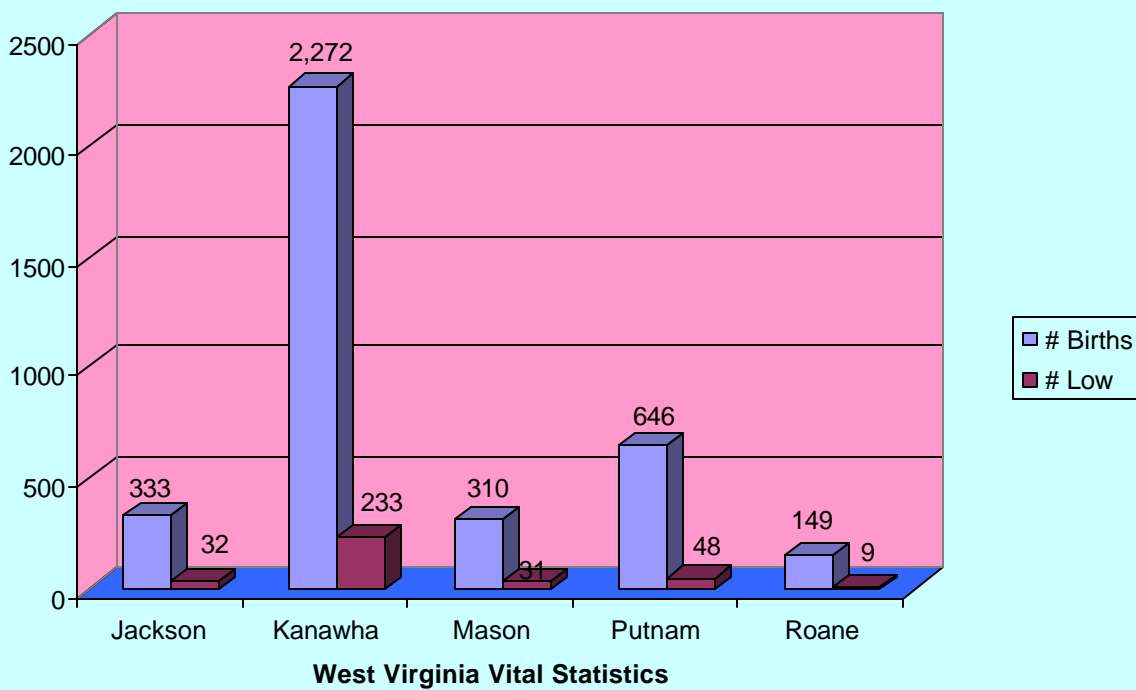
### % Births Prenatal Care Began 2005

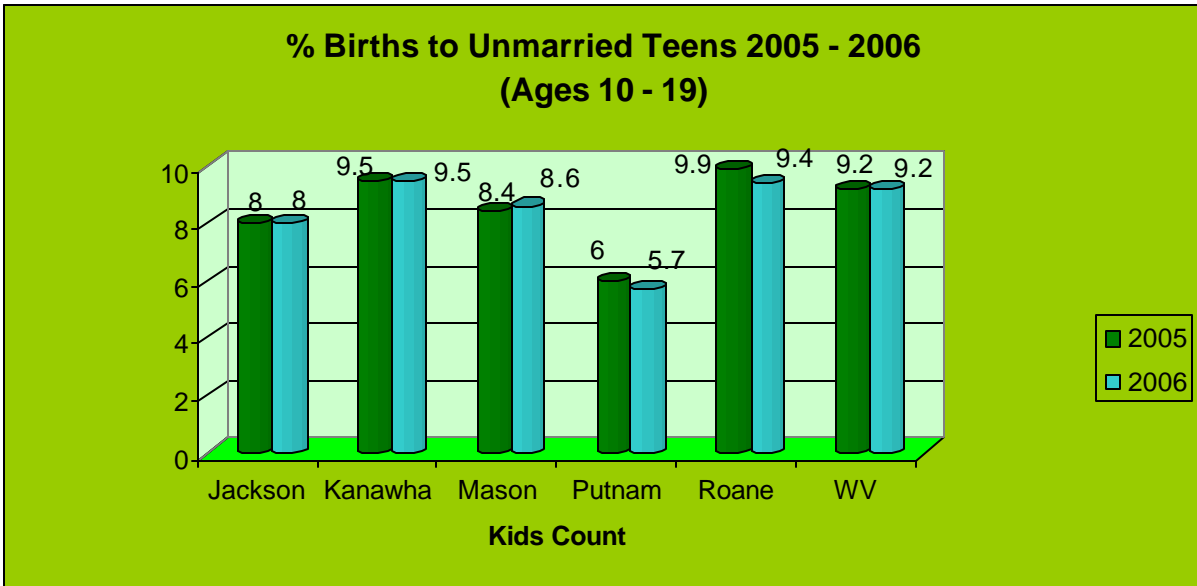
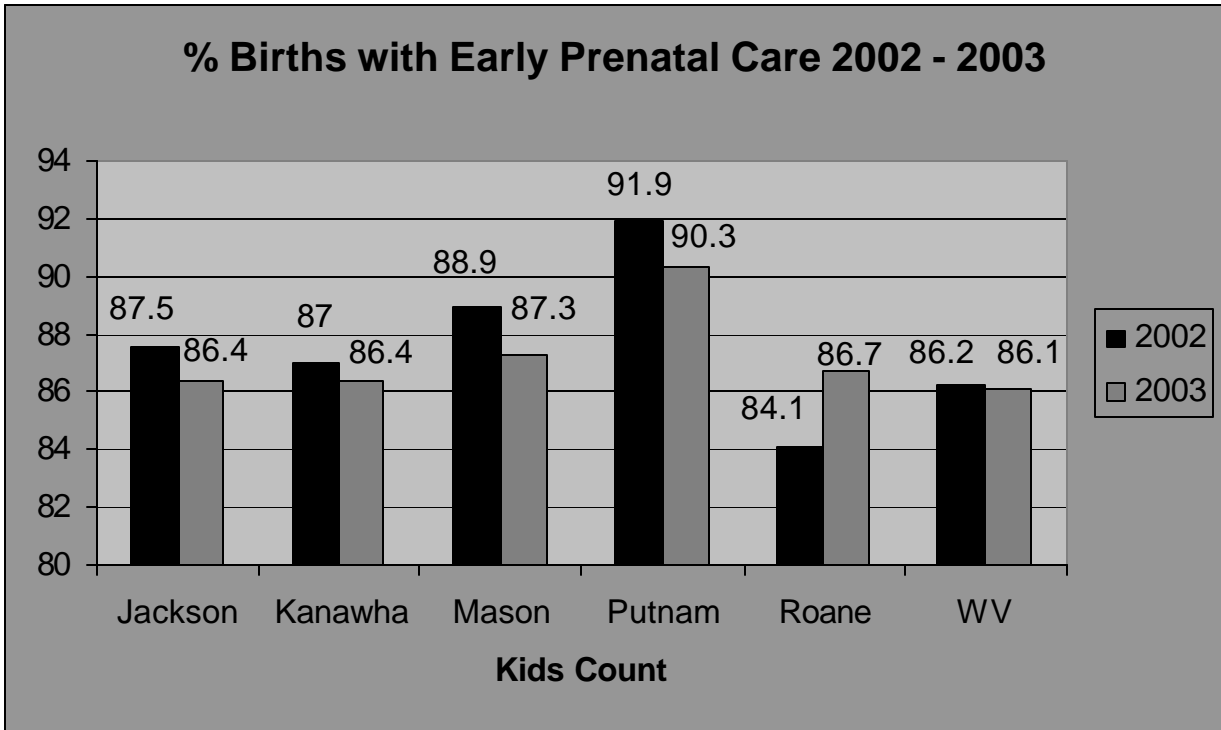


### % Low Birth Weight Babies 2004 - 2005

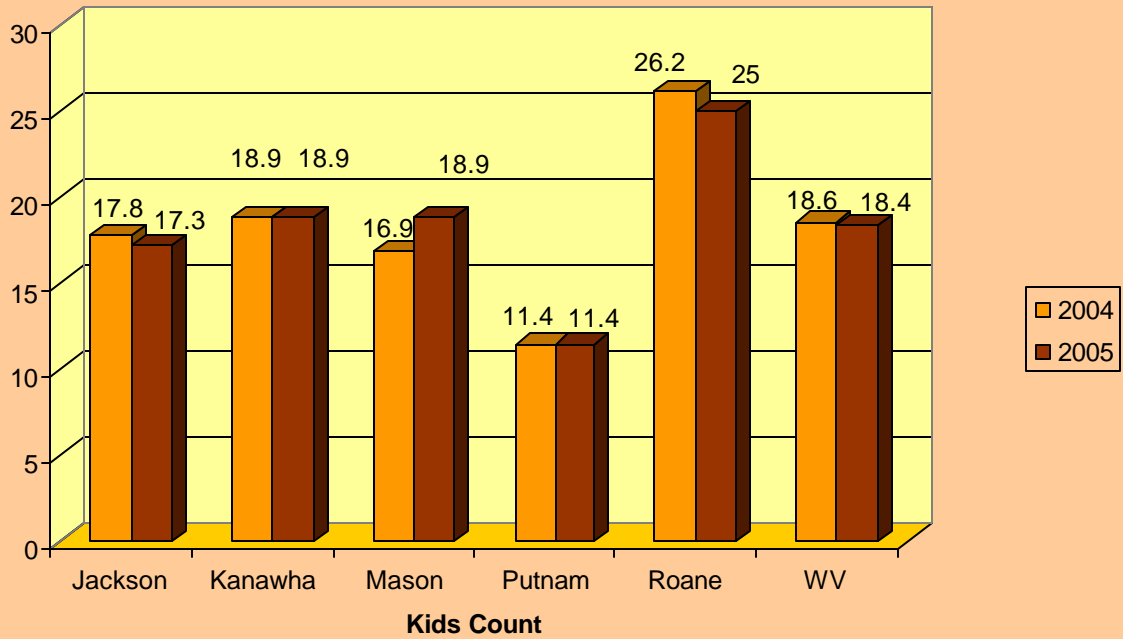


### Low Birth Rate Babies 2005

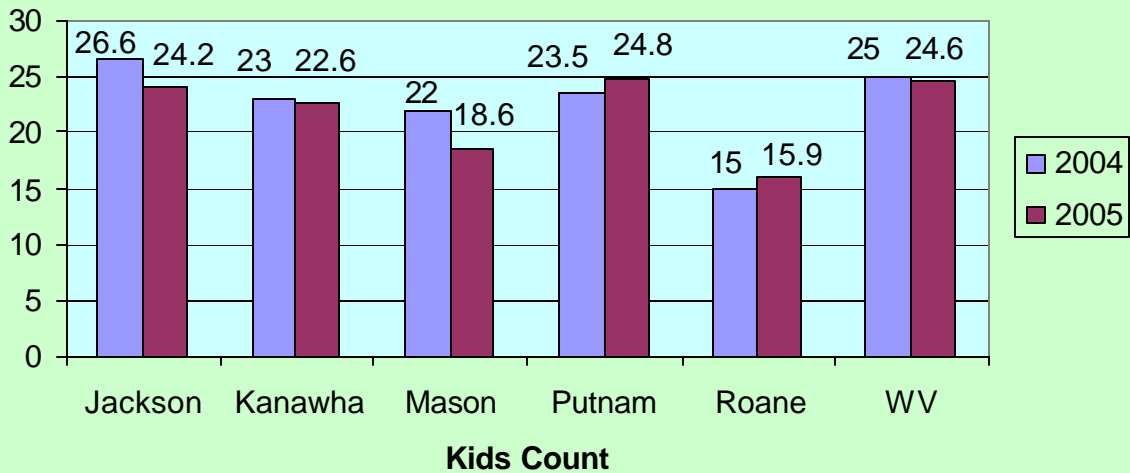


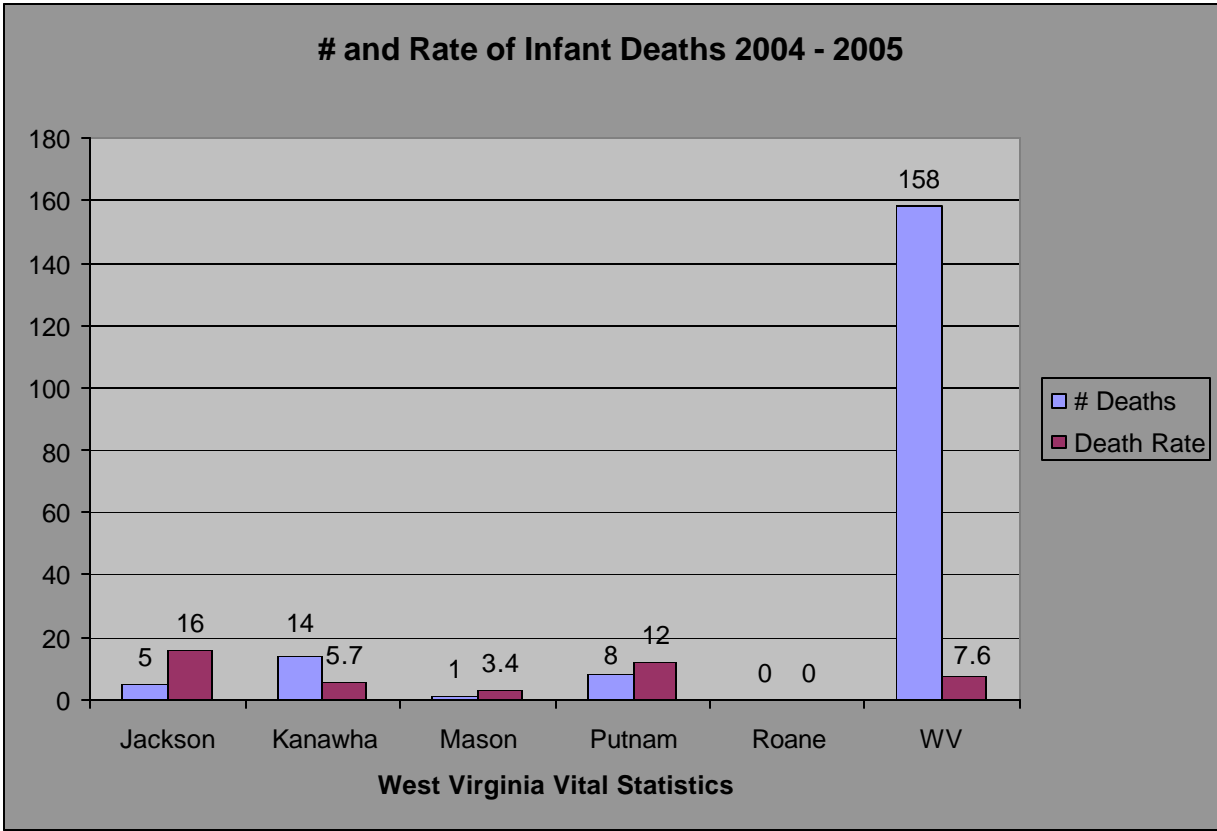
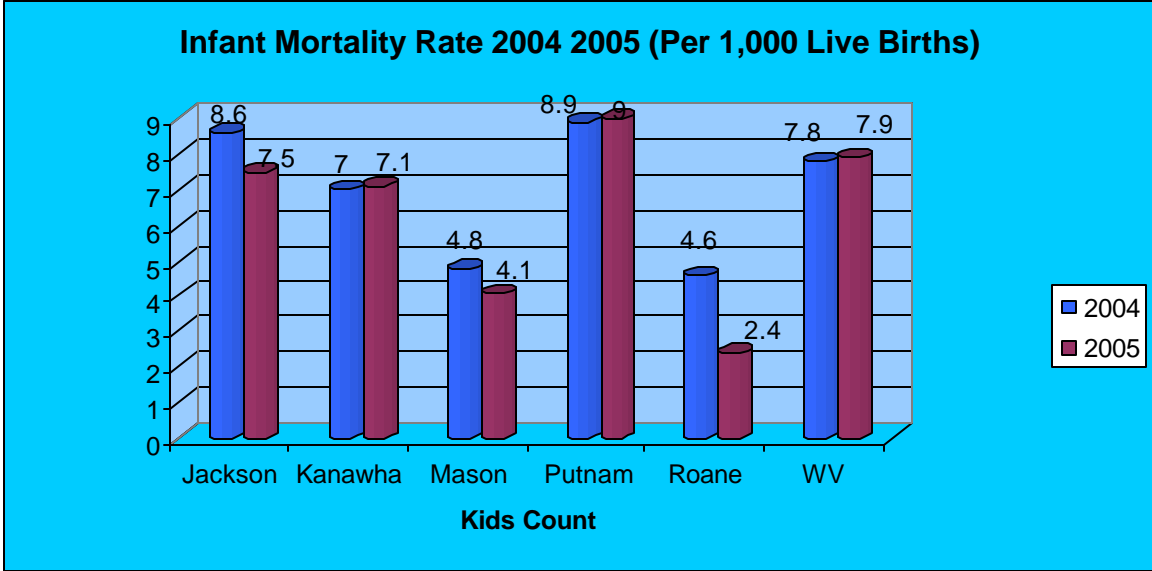


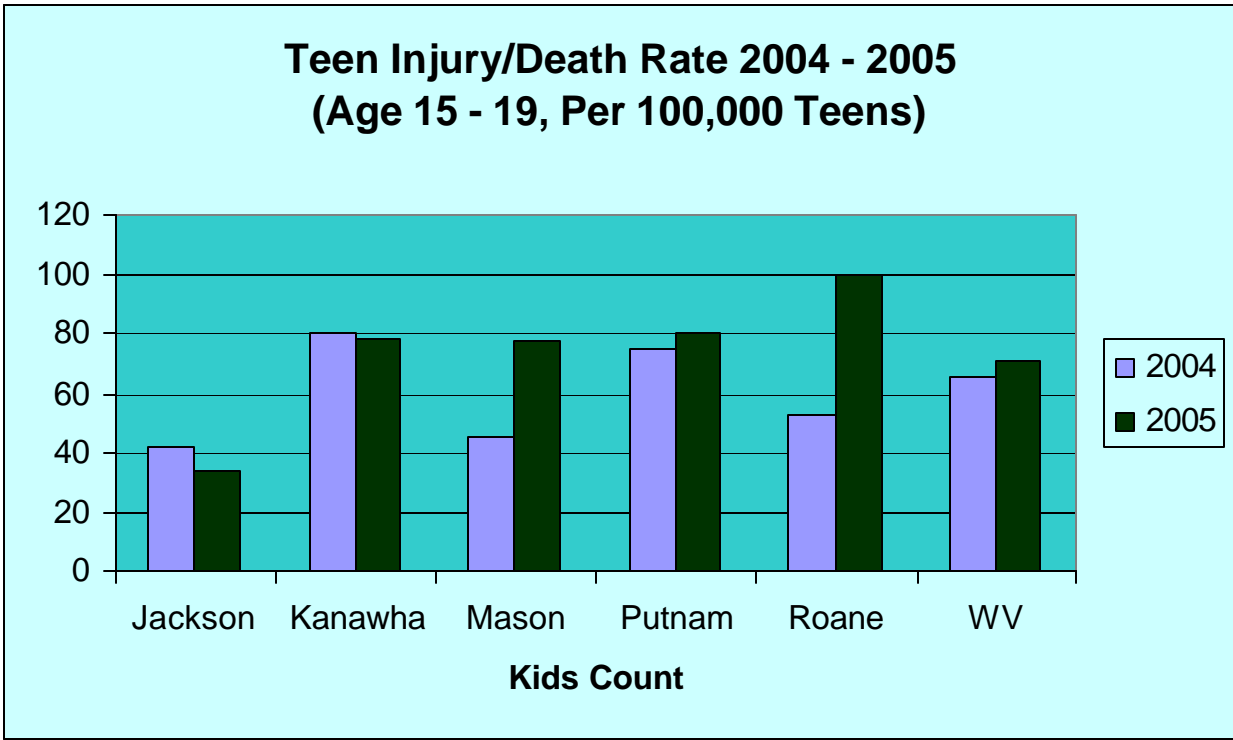
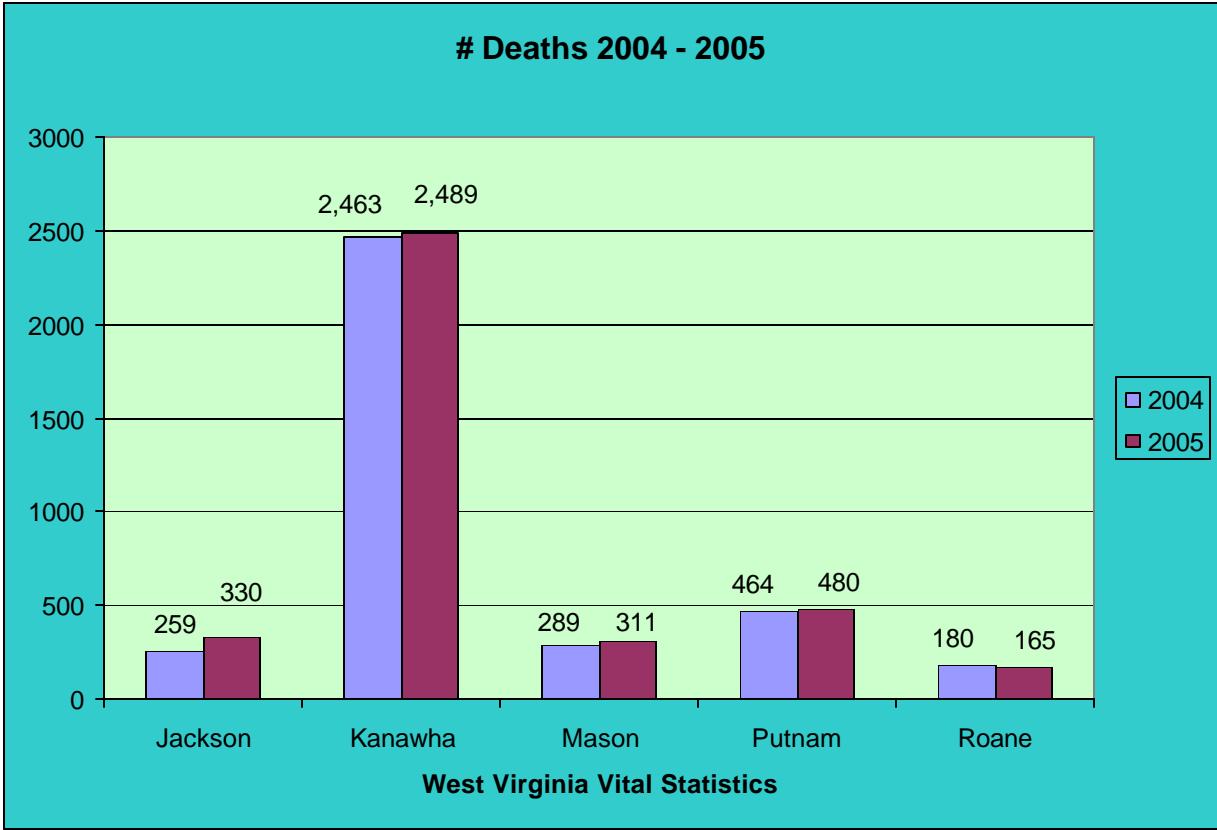

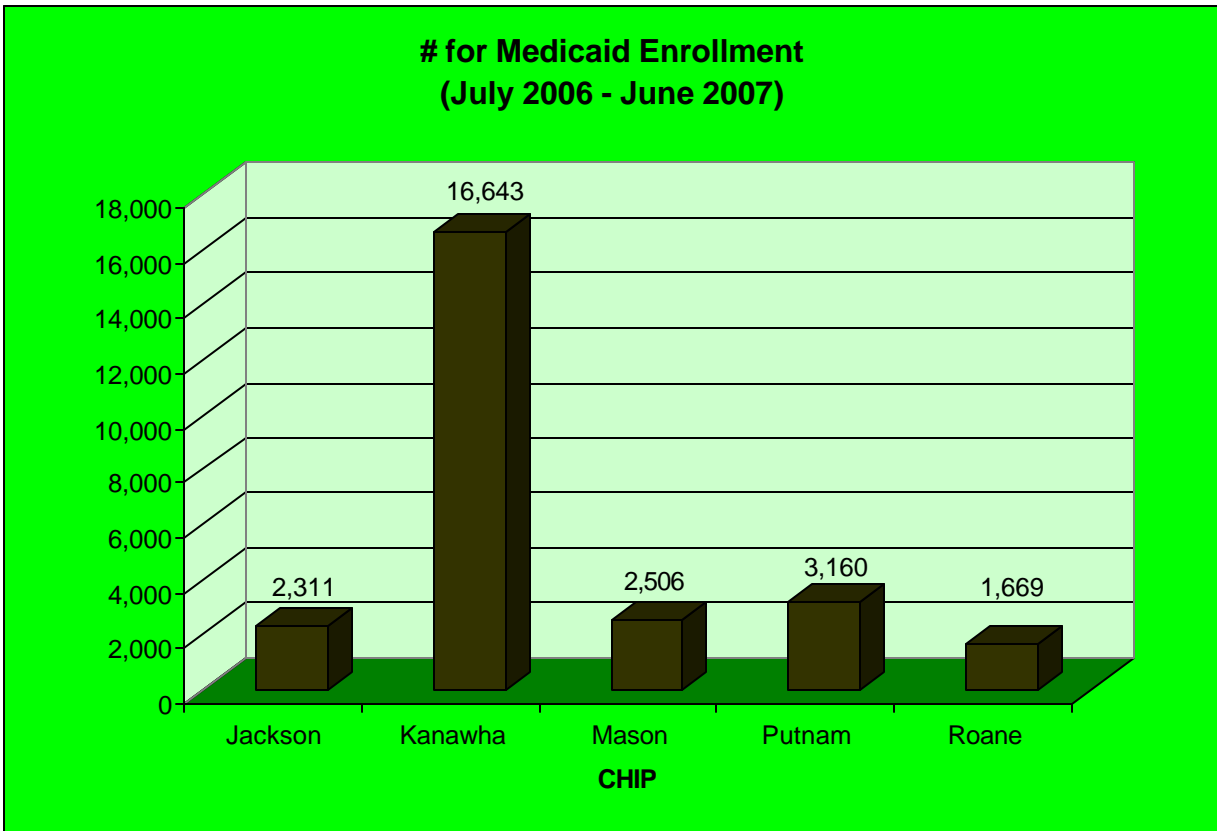
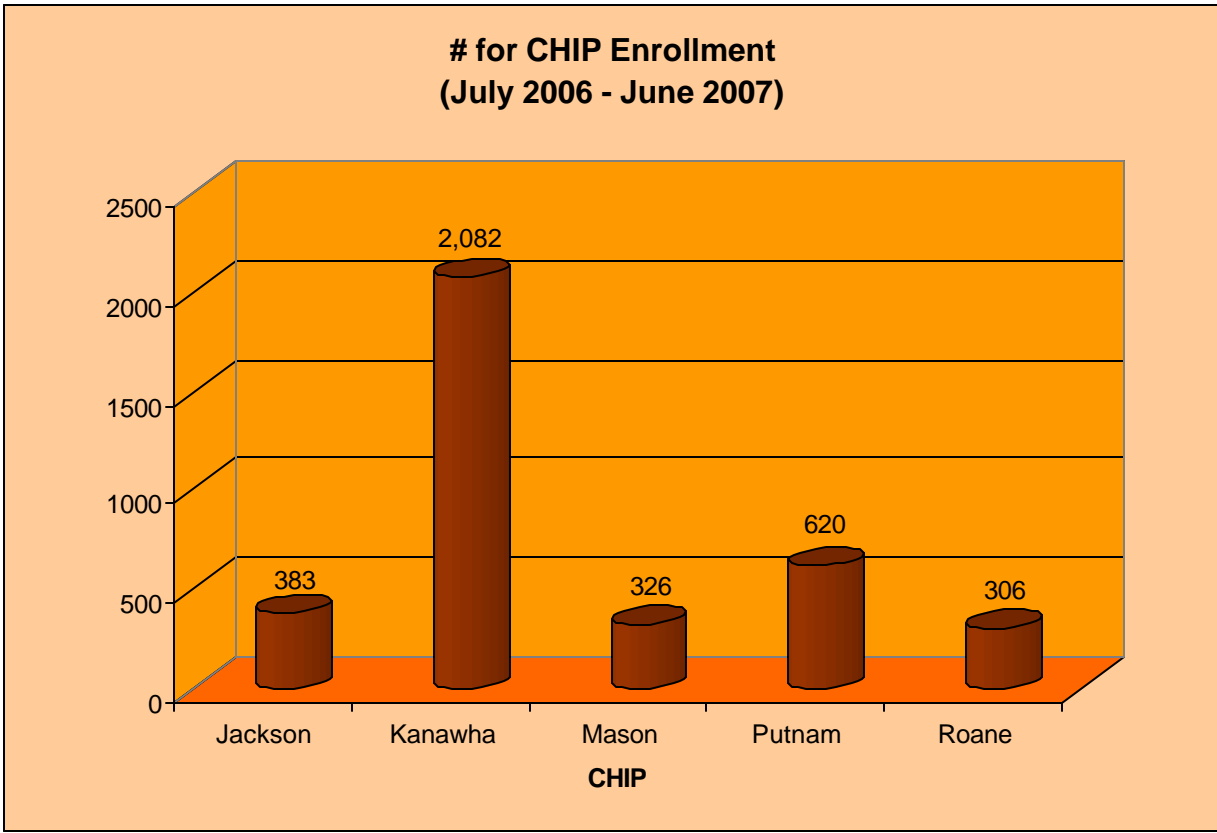


**Child Death Rate  
(Ages 1- 14, Per 100,000, Children 2004 2005)**

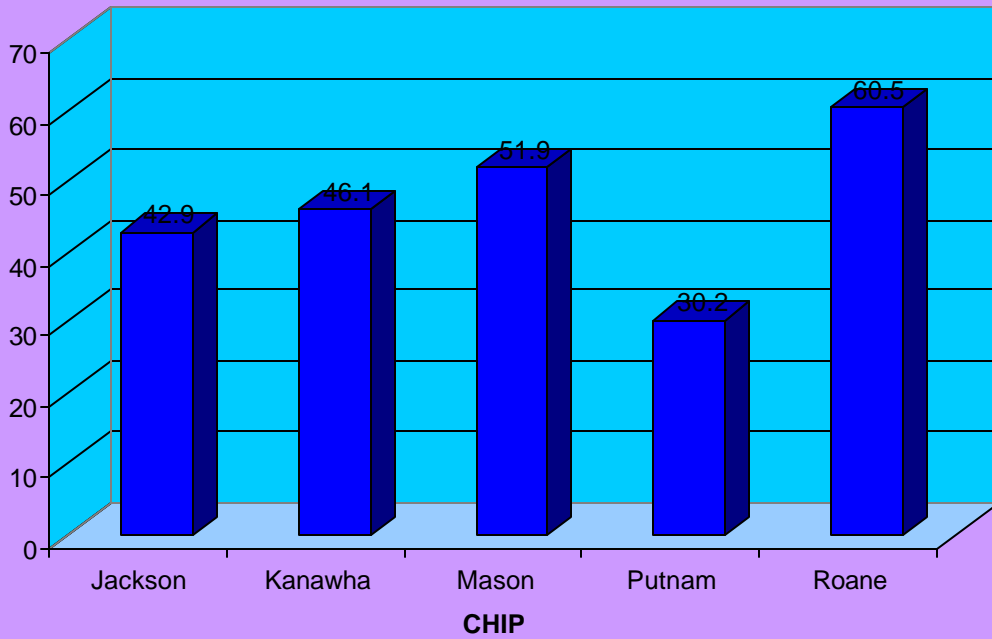




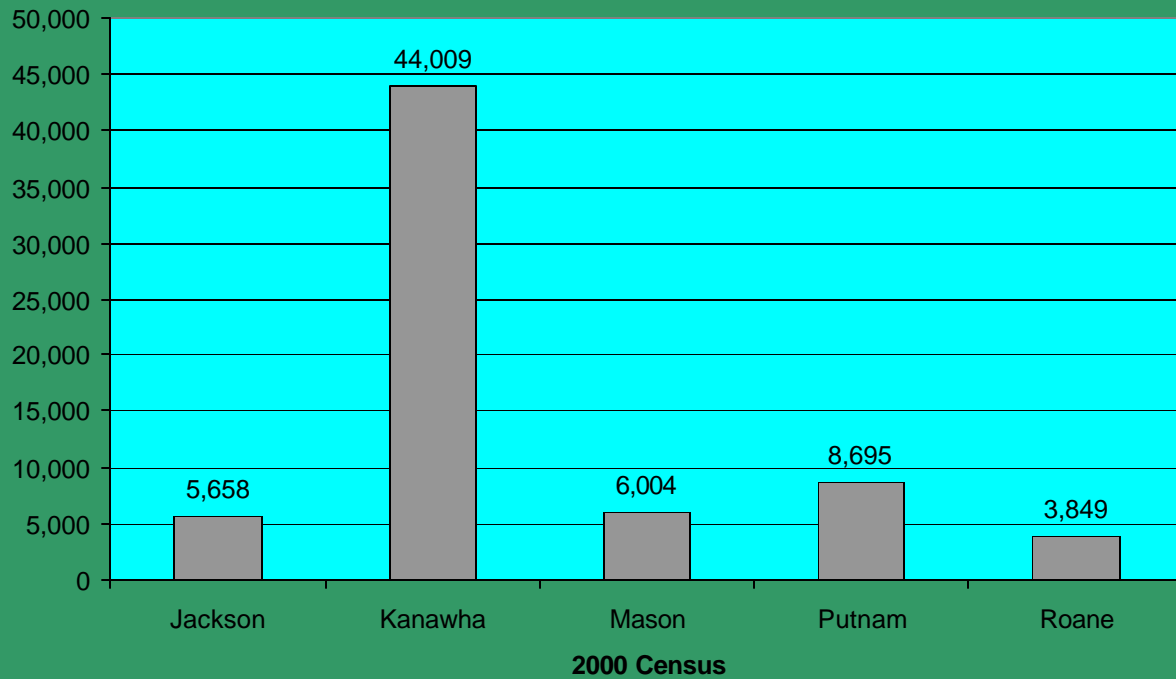


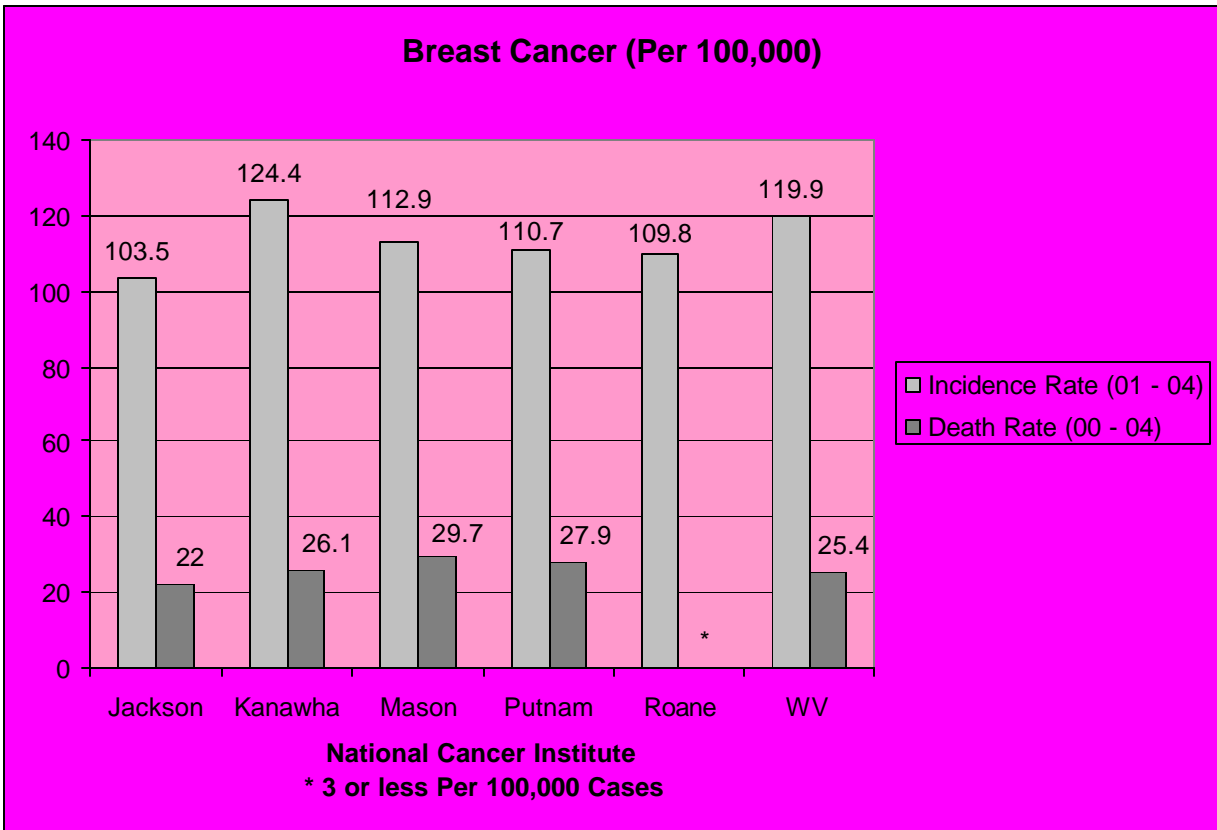
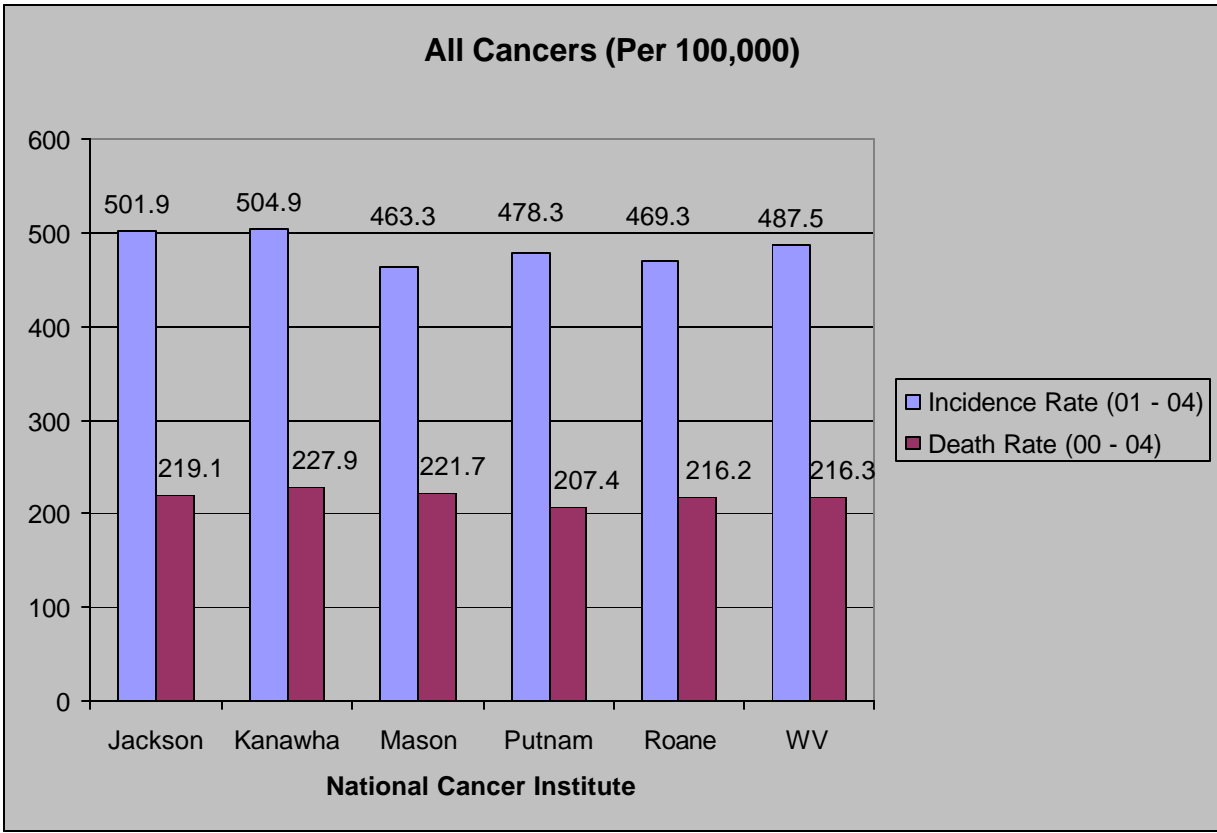


**% of Population for CHIP/Medicaid Enrollment  
(July 2006 - June 2007)**

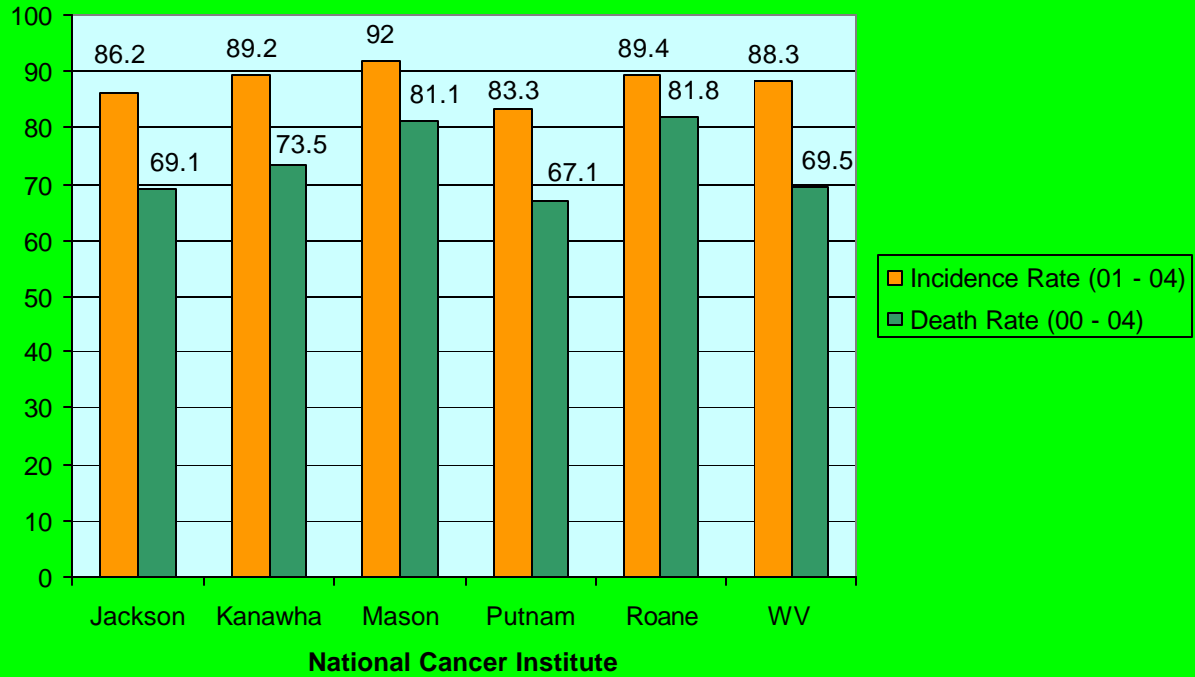

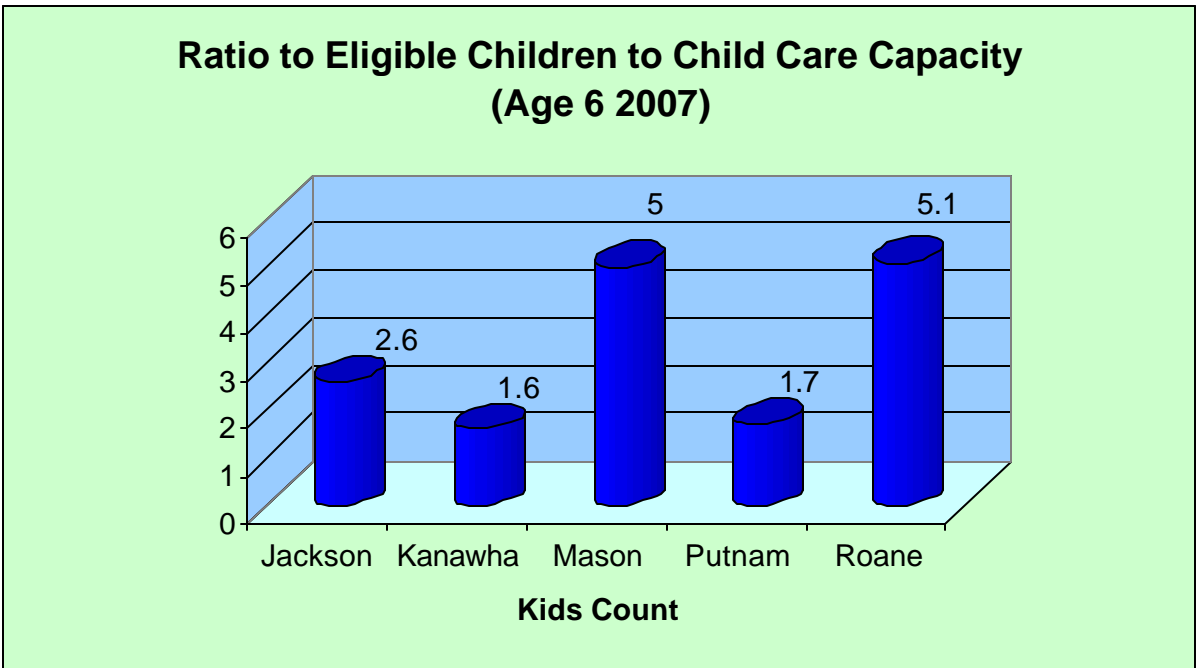
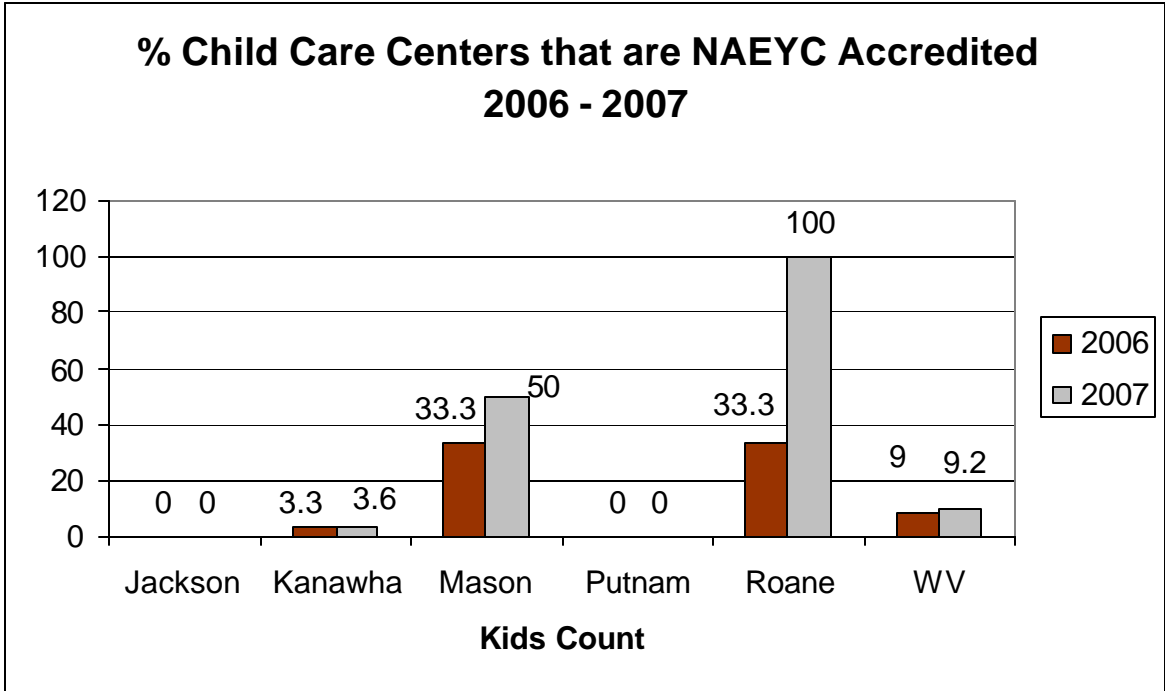


**# of Licensed Child Care Centers 2006 - 2007**

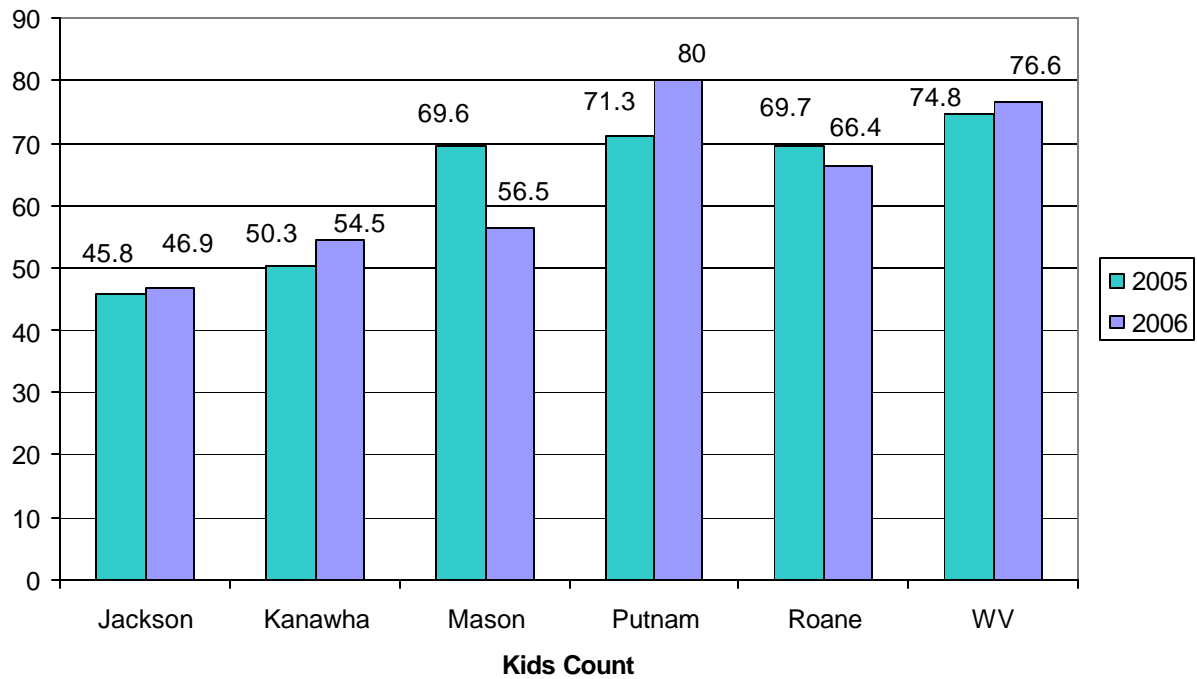

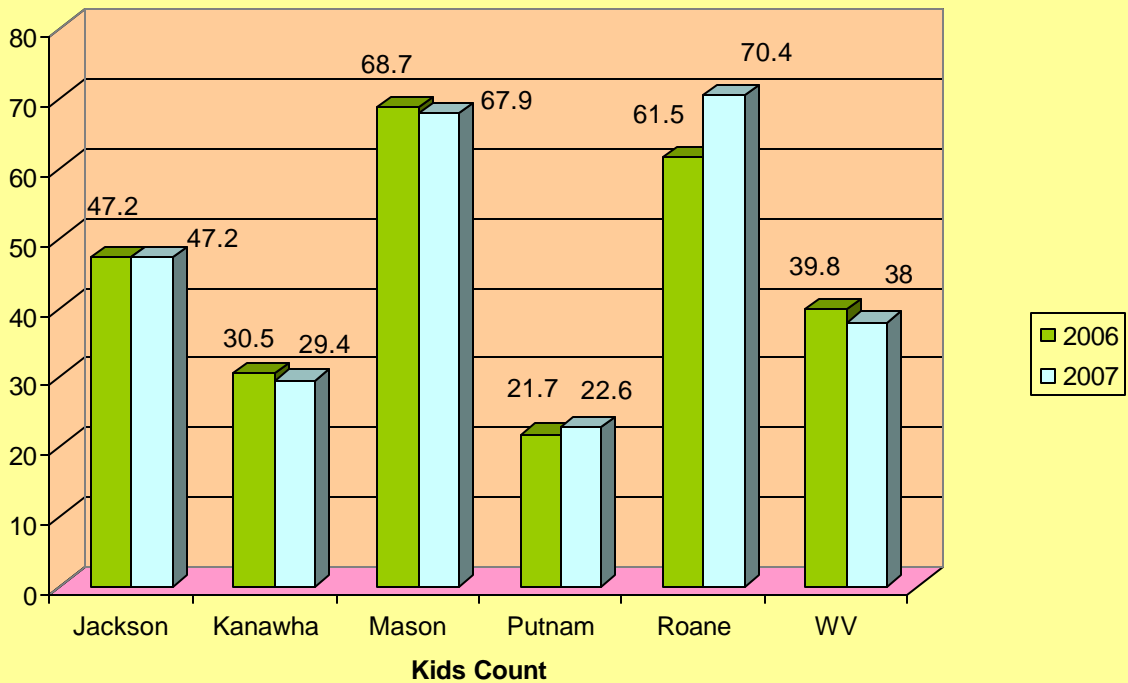




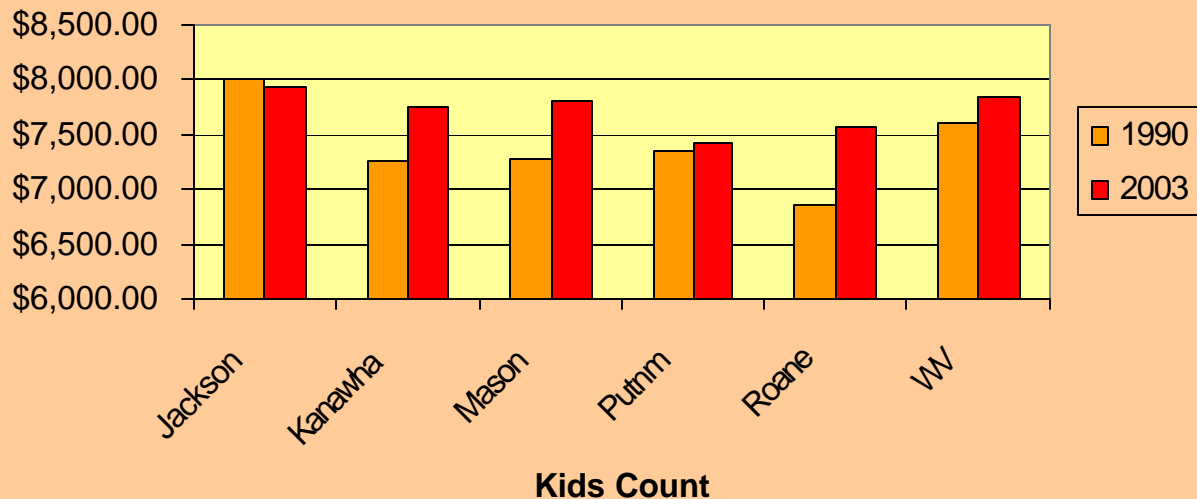
**% of Eligible Children Served by Head Start 2005 - 2006**



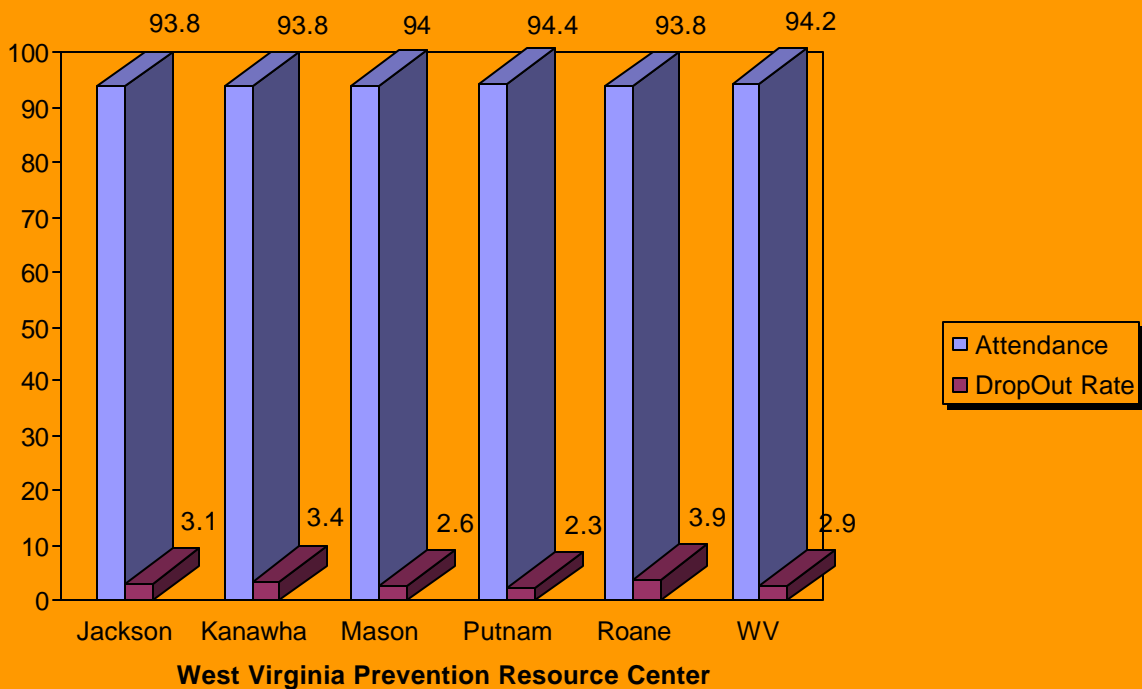
**% Children 4 Yrs. Old Enrolled in Pre-K 2006 - 2007**



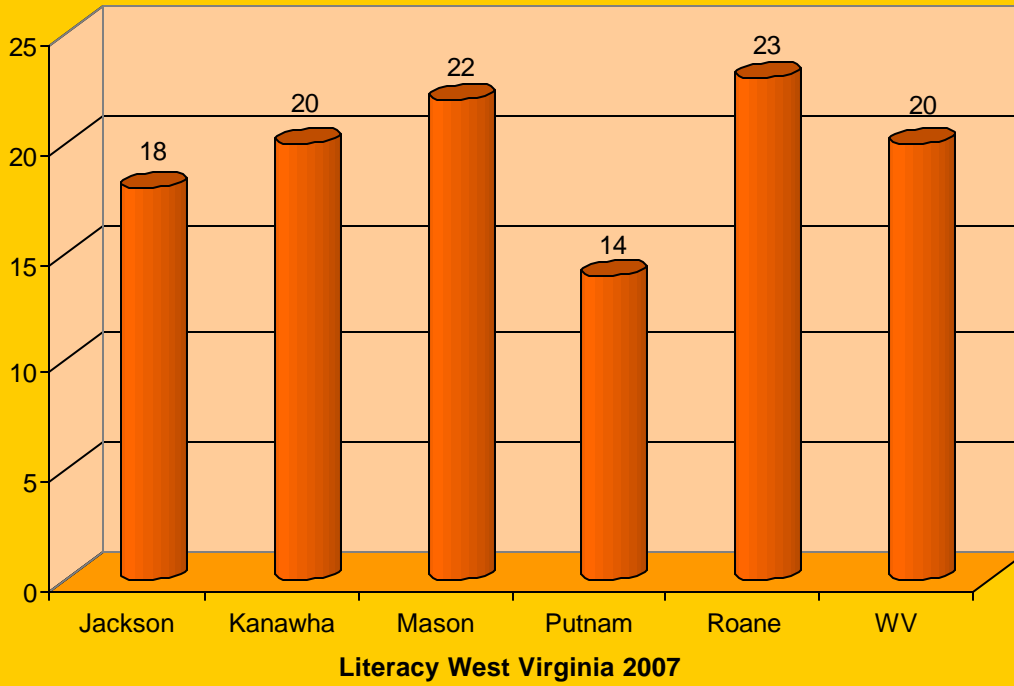
### Education Expenditures Per Pupil (2004 Dollars) 1990 2003



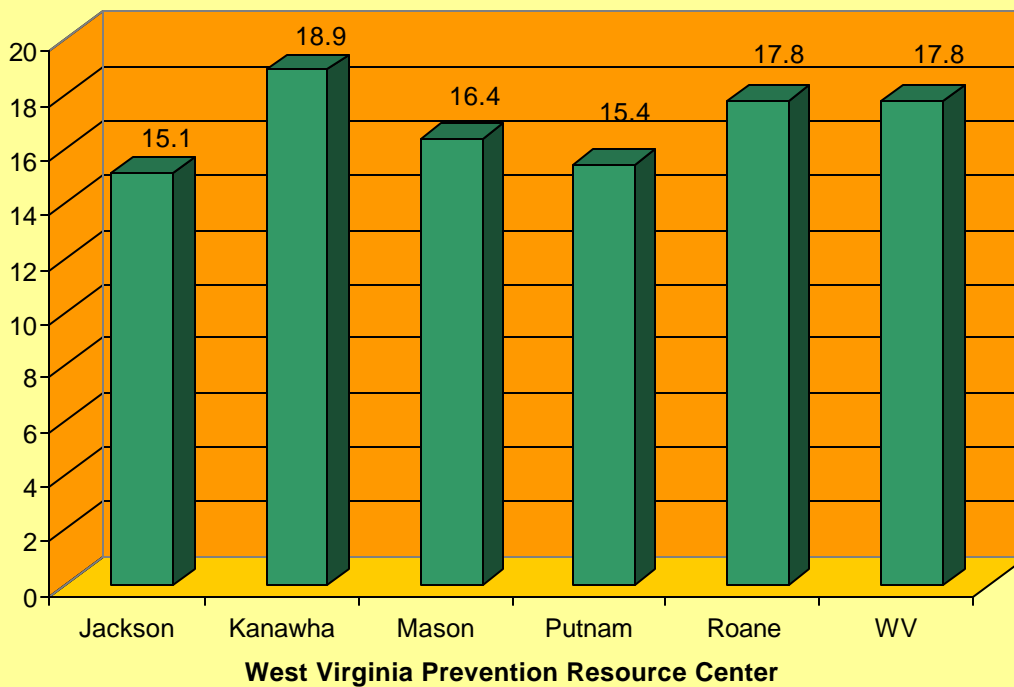
### School Attendance/Dropout Rate 1999 - 2002



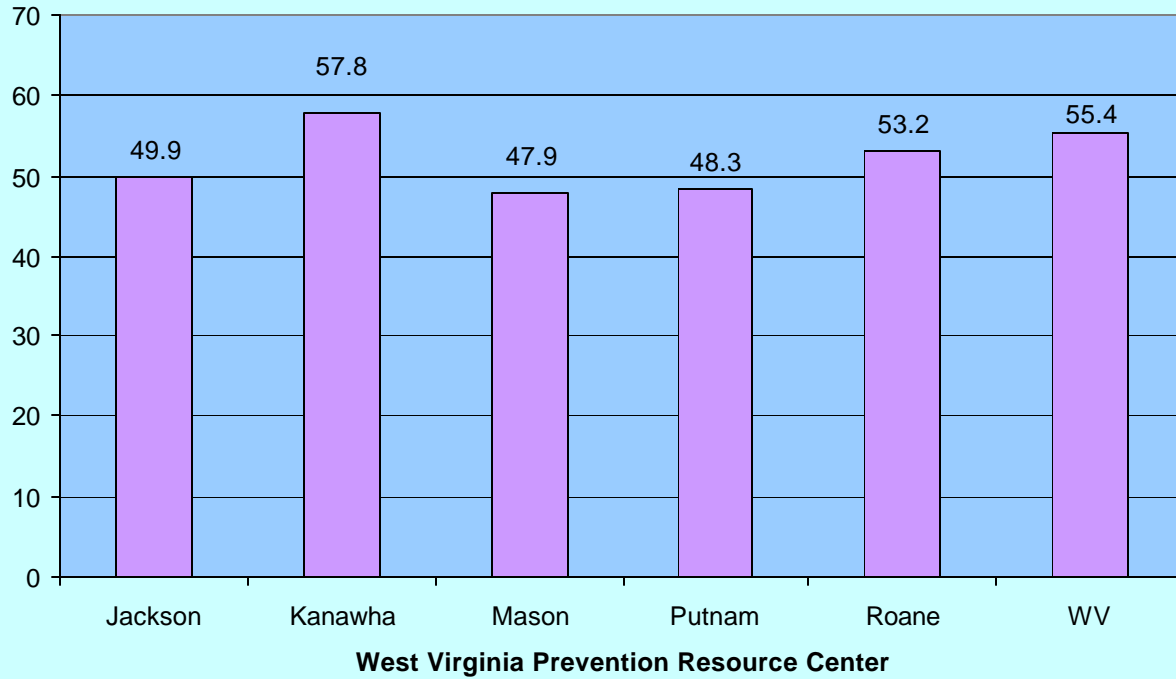
**% Adults Who Read at Level 1 (3rd Grade or Less)**



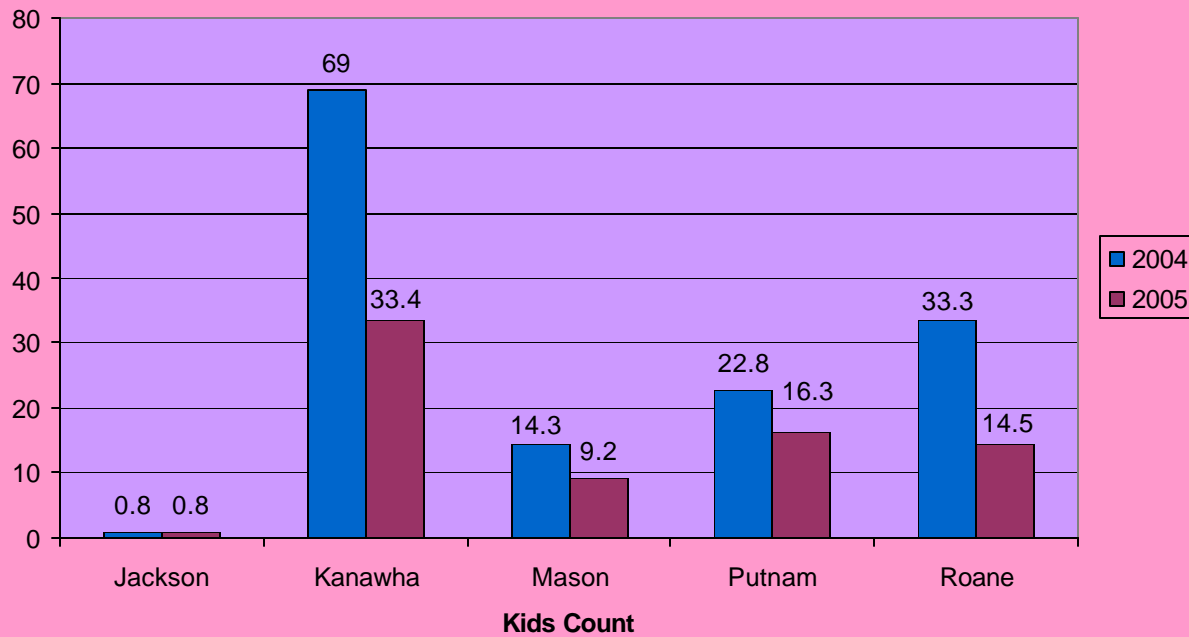
**Parents Who Never or Seldom Enforce Rules 2003**



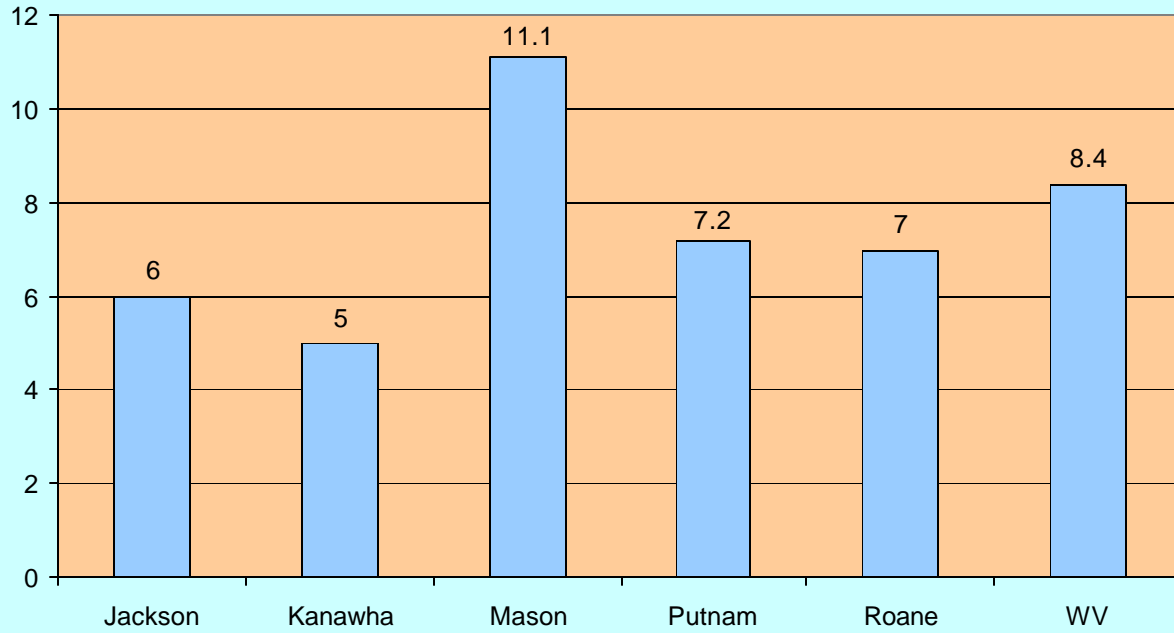
### Youth Who Never Participate in Community Activities 2003



### Juvenile Delinquency Case Rate (Age 10 - 17 Per 1,000) 2004 - 2005

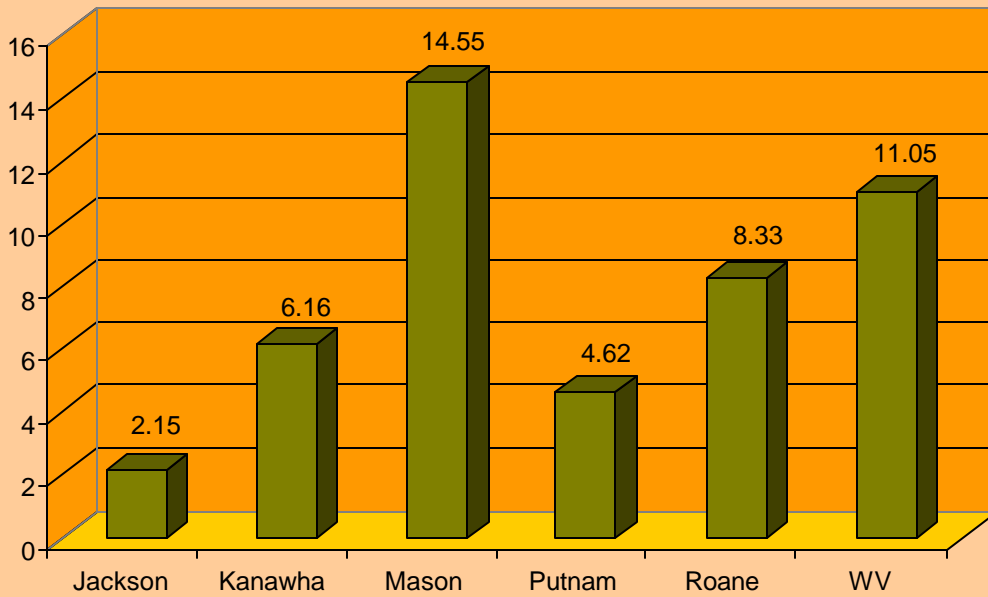


**% Smokeless Tobacco Use by Youth 2003**



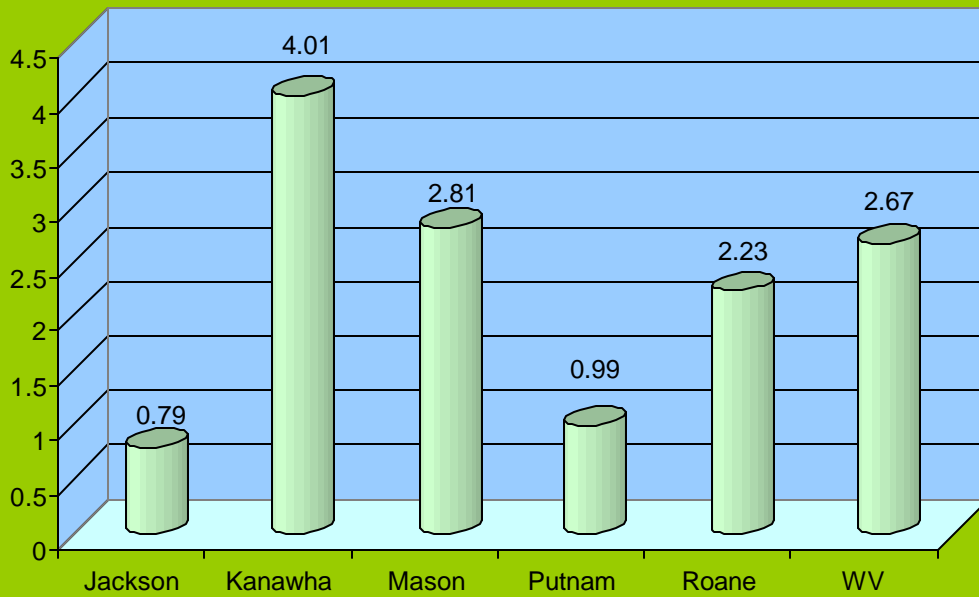

**Comprehensive Mental Health Services with Other Opiates/Synthetics as Primary (Adults 2003)**



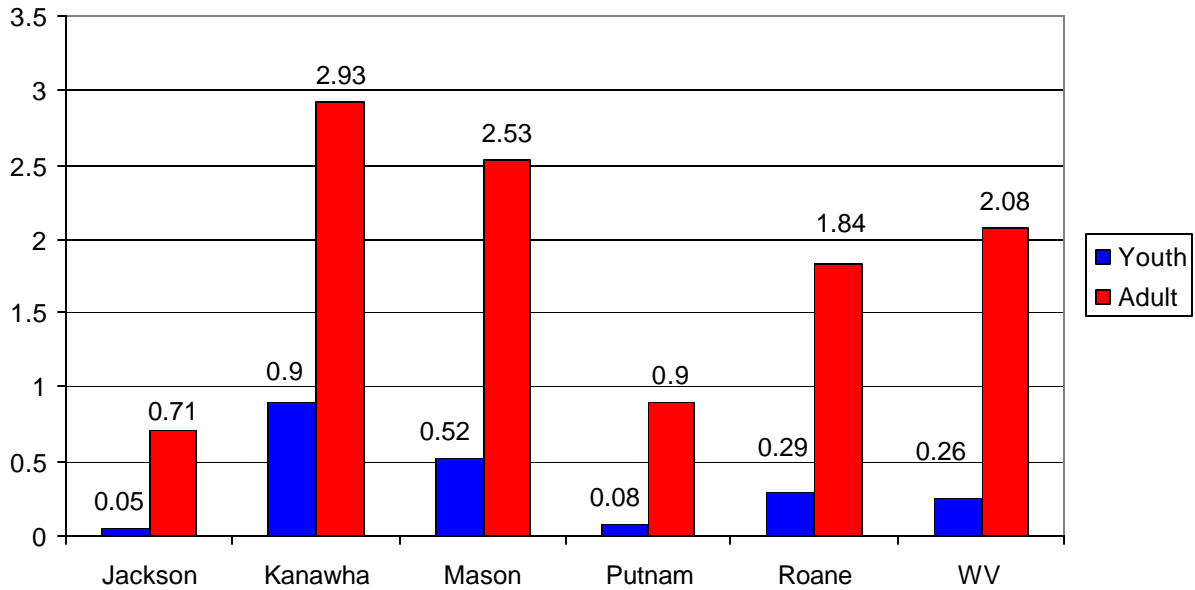

(Per 1,000 Population 2001 - 2003)**



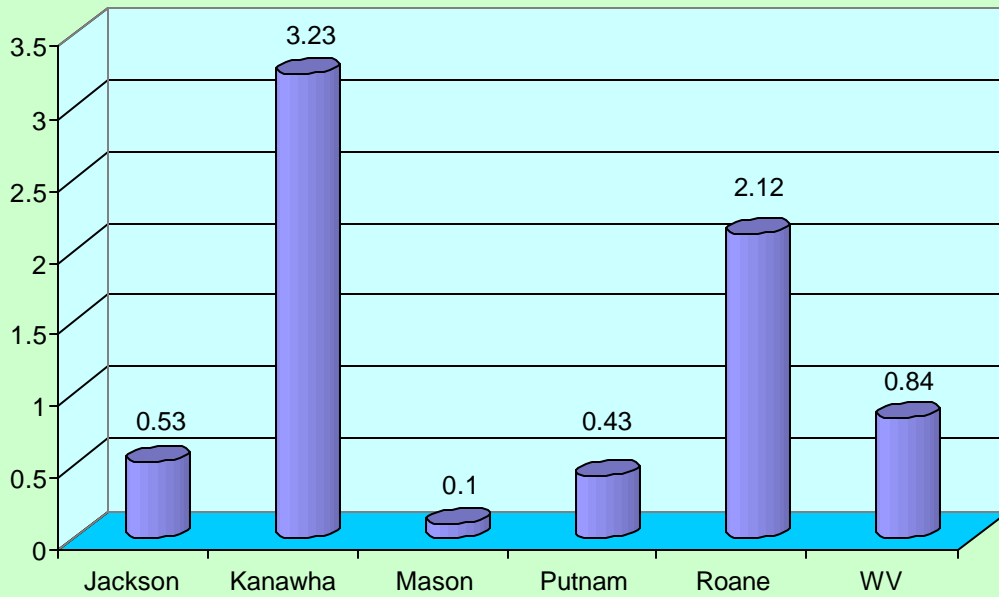

(Per 1,000 Population 2001 - 2002)**



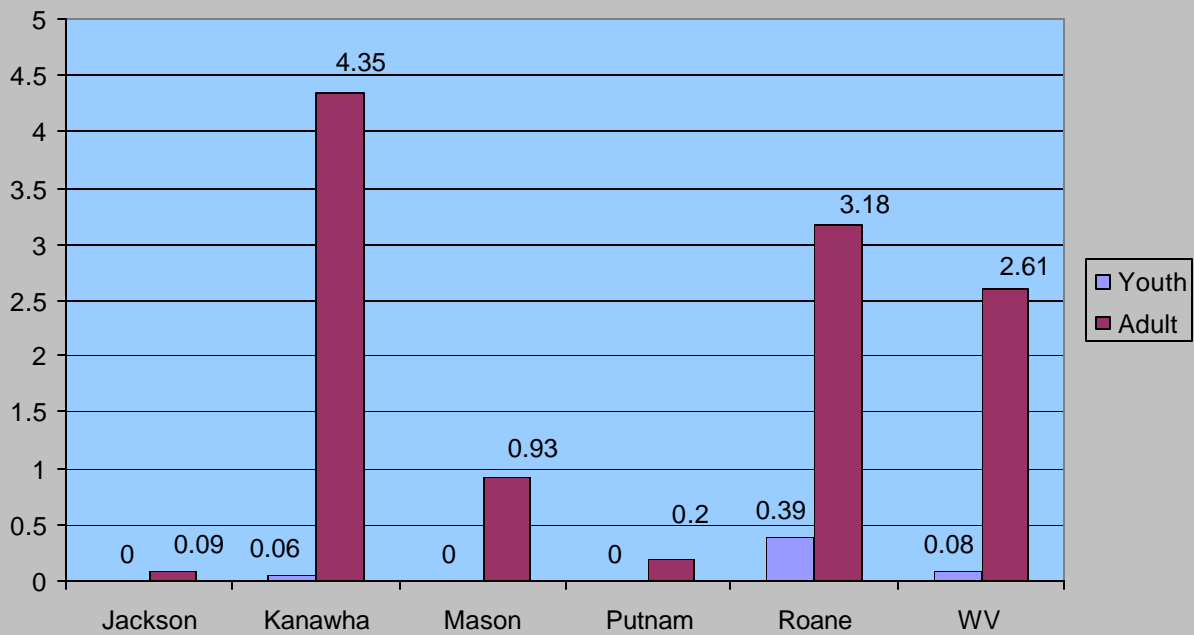

(Per 10,000; 2001 - 2003)**



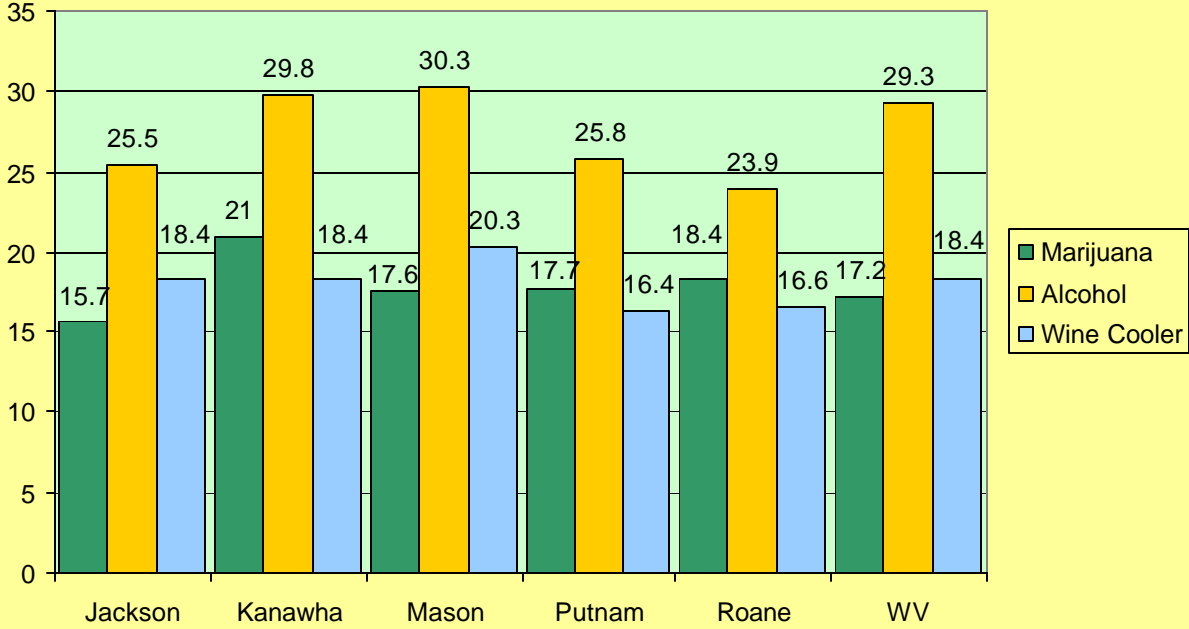
