...that marijuana use causes impaired memory and impaired learning ability, increased heart rate, anxiety, and panic attacks?



...that one 12 oz. beer has the same amount of alcohol that a 5 oz. glass of wine or a 1.5 shot of whiskey?

...that a high number of car crashes, falls, burns, drowning & suicide have been linked to alcohol and drug use?



...that spit tobacco is as dangerous and addictive as cigarettes?
